Why a PG 13 Rating?

This PVHS production has been designated with a PG-13 rating due to mature content. The play is considered to be a dark comedy. While the plot is similar to both the original movie and stage production, its content has been modified to the "Teen Version" where certain scenes have been omitted to be appropriate for audiences that are 13 years or older.

How to Talk to Your Child

Bullying affects 20% of high school students today and has remained prevalent across the nation. While bullying is not always a direct cause of suicide, it is a risk factor that can contribute to ideation*. If you believe your child may be affected by bullying, suicide, or any of the themes mentioned, it would be ideal to have a conversation with your student before they see the show in order to prepare them for its content.

"What Should I Do If My Child is Being Bullied?"**:

1. Listen to your child openly and calmly
2. Reassure your child
3. Contact appropriate sources (counselor, administration) for support
4. Continue to support your child's needs
5. Monitor online communication if necessary

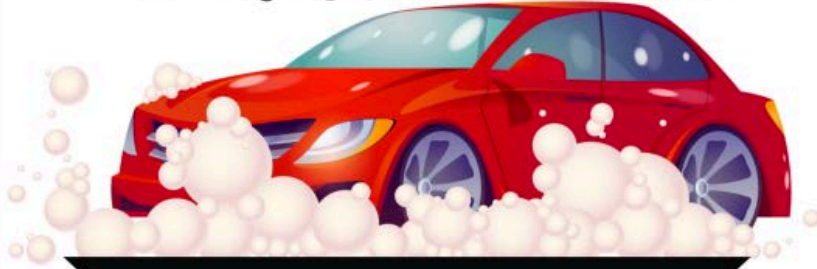

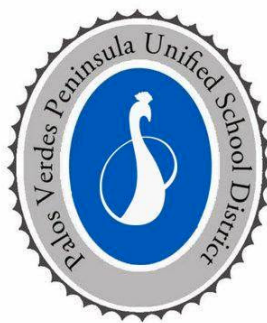

In October 2023, the PVPUSD school board took a substantial step towards updating the 2006 Advanced Placement U.S. History curriculum by approving two textbooks for a pilot that were aligned with the updated 2015 College Board requirements. Subsequently, in January 2024, the board extended this effort by approving a third textbook for inclusion in the ongoing pilot. The ultimate goal is to select one of these textbooks for an official adoption at an upcoming Spring board meeting.

The three textbooks currently undergoing rigorous review are:

- Fraser, James. *By the People: A History of the United States*, 3rd Edition, Pearson, 2024.
- Davidson, James West, et al. *Experience History: Interpreting America's Past*, 9th Edition, McGraw-Hill Education, 2019.
- **Newly Board Approved 3rd Pilot:** Cohen, Lizabeth and Kennedy, David M. *The American Pageant, AP® Edition*, 17th Edition, Cengage 2020.

The Centre for Sport and Human Rights launched its [Generation 2026: Youth Media Forward Initiative](#) in December 2023. The Centre is now inviting applications for the first cohort of 20 youth reporters: we are inviting applications from 15-17 year olds based in four of the FIFA World Cup 2026 host cities: Guadalajara; Toronto; Los Angeles; New York New Jersey.

WHY APPLY?

The program is an exciting opportunity to hone your skills, build a peer network, report stories and share opinions: on the human rights dimensions of sports in your community, and in connection with the FIFA World Cup 2026.

As a Youth Media Forward reporter, you will receive:

- **Training on reporting the human rights dimensions of sport** and ensuring responsible reporting practices, across print, broadcast and online media. Dimensions may include (but not be limited to): access and diversity, safety in sport, the impacts of major sporting events and the roles and responsibilities of different stakeholders; and the working conditions for people involved in or affected by major events.
- **Opportunities to submit stories for publication**, through partnerships with media outlets.
- **Interactive sessions with media industry leaders.**
- And, through the above activities, the **opportunity to help inform and shape the future of sports media**, with a focus on stories that advance human rights.
