SCC

What is SCC?

SCC is a Student centered mentoring group between selected students and the Palos Verdes Estates Police Chief. This is a new program started by the Police Chief to give you the tools to make good decision in the future. Time will also be spent on topics of interest to students including: drugs, laws, safety and, police-youth interactions. SCC is an elective class with an academic and a citizenship grade. The grade is shown as a Period 7 Peer Mentoring Class on the transcript. It is a branch of the Peer Mentoring Class taught by Principal Dr. Charles Park and grades will be given by Dr. Park.

What does SCC do?

SCC members will meet twice a month with the Police Chief. The first meeting of each month will focus on discussion of leadership, critical thinking, and decision making. At the conclusion of the first meeting, students will be given a case to analyze. The second meeting of each month will focus on student discussion how they addresses key issues presented in the case. Special attention will be given to the aspects of leadership, how to think critically, and how to make informed decisions. Student will also have an opportunity to meet police officers on a personal level, participate in ride-a-longs, and will be assigned a law-enforcement project they must complete by the end of the semester. Project may include:

- Speakers at different forms
- Develop strategies to improve student-police relations
- Provide input for the revision of police policies
- Complete a project at the police department
- Complete a project to help the youth in Palos Verdes Estates

Three students from each grade level will be selected. **Applications are currently available.** Applications will be reviewed by Chief Velez and Dr. Park. OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES:

Student Pollworker Program: The Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk would like to encourage students of 16 years of age or older to **volunteer as a student pollworker** for the **upcoming June 5, 2018 Statewide Direct Primary Election** (*please note that June 5 is the first day of Finals*). Students are expected to be present at the polling place **from 6 a.m. to approximately 9:30 p.m.** For the convenience of both students and parents, students are assigned to a precinct in close proximity to their home or school. All students who are placed are required to attend a two-hour training session prior to Election Day. In addition to gaining an invaluable learning experience about the democratic process, **students receive \$100 for serving on Election Day and an additional \$40 bonus for attending a training class.**

Any high school student that meets the following requirements may apply:

- Must be a U.S. Citizen or Legal Permanent Resident **AND** 16 years of age
- Must be attending a public/private secondary institution
- Must be in good academic standing with a GPA of 2.5 or greater
- Must have teacher and parental consent.

In order to be considered for this program, **students must complete the Student Pollworker Application which will be available in the College and Career Center beginning on Monday, February 12. All applications must be returned to Mrs. Hoffman in the College and Career Center no later than Thursday, March 1.** Please note that the program will **ONLY** accept 17 students from PVHS.

The Eve and Gene Black Summer Medical Career Program is a great summer opportunity best described as a **medical mentor program**. Students work under the supervision of a health care educator shadowing various medical professionals (nurse, nutritionist, pharmacist, lab technician and/or physician) who together provide a range of patient care and services. The program accepts applications from high school students who are **current 11th and 12th graders AND born ON or BEFORE 4/1/2002**. The 2018 program has 2, 3, and 4 week programs available in July/August. **There is no fee to participate.** Applications may be downloaded from <http://www.lapedsoc.org/summer> .
