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OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES:

Questbridge College Prep Scholars Program: This program prepares high-achieving, low-income 11th graders to be admitted to the nation's best colleges, and possibly attend for free. College Prep Scholars could receive special awards, such as full scholarships to college summer programs, exclusive access to 40 top colleges at a National College Admissions Conference, all-expense-paid campus visits, and more. **This program is for high school juniors** who have shown outstanding academic ability (top 5%-10% of your graduating class) despite financial challenges. College Prep Scholars typically come from **households earning less than \$65,000 annually for a family of four** with minimal assets. Applicants must be planning to apply to college during the fall of their senior year. The application is now open, and the deadline for students to apply is **March 21, 2018**.

Student Pollworker Program: The Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk would like to encourage students of 16 years of age or older to **volunteer as a student pollworker** for the **upcoming June 5, 2018 Statewide Direct Primary Election** (*please note that June 5 is the first day of Finals*). Students are expected to be present at the polling place from **6 a.m. to approximately 9:30 p.m.** In addition to gaining an invaluable learning experience about the democratic process, **students receive \$100 for serving on Election Day and an additional \$40 bonus for attending a training class.**

Any high school student that meets the following requirements may apply:

- Must be a U.S. Citizen or Legal Permanent Resident AND 16 years of age
- Must be attending a public/private secondary institution
- Must be in good academic standing with a GPA of 2.5 or greater
- Must have teacher and parental consent.

In order to be considered for this program, **students must complete the Student Pollworker Application which is available in the College and Career Center. All applications must be returned to Mrs. Hoffman in the College and Career Center no later than March 1.** Please note that the program will ONLY accept 17 students from PVHS.

2018 LA BioMed Summer Fellowship Program: This program provides Los Angeles County **graduating high school seniors and high school juniors** the opportunity to work in a biomedical research environment. Selected students will spend eight weeks assisting their assigned mentors, who are accomplished medical scientists involved in cutting edge biomedical research. The summer fellows are exposed to ongoing research projects and participate in a well-defined protocol that can be completed during the summer program. **Fellowships begin on Monday, June 18th, 2018 and continue through Friday, August 10th, 2018.** Further details about this opportunity
