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OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES:

Questbridge College Prep Scholars Program: This program prepares high-achieving, low-income 11th graders to be admitted to the nation's best colleges, and possibly attend for free. College Prep Scholars could receive special awards, such as full scholarships to college summer programs, exclusive access to 40 top colleges at a National College Admissions Conference, all-expense-paid campus visits, and more. **This program is for high school juniors** who have shown outstanding academic ability (top 5%-10% of your graduating class) despite financial challenges. College Prep Scholars typically come from **households earning less than \$65,000 annually for a family of four** with minimal assets. Applicants must be planning to apply to college during the fall of their senior year.
