

OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES

The EVE and GENE BLACK SUMMER MEDICAL CAREER PROGRAM is an opportunity best described as a medical mentor program. Students work under the supervision of a health care educator shadowing various medical professionals (nurse, nutritionist, pharmacist, lab technician, and/or physician) who together provide a range of patient care and services. The program accepts applications from high school students who are current 11th and 12th graders AND born ON or BEFORE 4/1/2003. The 2019 program has 2, 3, and 4 week programs. FEBRUARY 1 - *ELK'S LEGACY AWARD* (\$4,000) — seniors only; any child/grandchild of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2016 is eligible to apply.
