

OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES

The **2020 Ignite LA Fellowships** are currently open to Los Angeles County high school **sophomores and juniors**. This opportunity sends students on an **all-expenses-paid Earthwatch expedition** over the summer to conduct hands-on scientific research in the field at a variety of locations throughout the country. The fellowship looks for students with energy, creativity, and a passion to learn, and is not based on academic performance. Applications are due by **December 4**. . • **NOVEMBER 5 - ELKS CLUB MVS FOUNDATION** (up to \$50,000) – seniors only; local/district/state/national competition; applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, community service, and financial need. Large emphasis on grades/test scores. To apply, log onto https://www.elks.org/scholars/scholarships/MVS.cfm

• **NOVEMBER 5 - PRUDENTIAL SPIRIT OF COMMUNITY AWARD** (\$1,000; \$5,000) - grades 5-12; state/national competition; recognizes volunteerism and the positive contributions of young people who make a difference in our community. Grades and test scores are NOT considered in the application. Applications are available online at <u>http://spirit.prudential.com</u>.

• DECEMBER 15 - AXA ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP (\$2,500, \$10,000, \$25,000) – seniors only; regional/state/national competition; recognizes those who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their activities in school, the community or the workplace. APPLY EARLY, only the first 10,000 applications will be accepted. To apply, log onto <u>https://www.scholarsapply.org/axa-achievement/</u>

• DECEMBER 15 - BURGER KING SCHOLARS PROGRAM (Varies) - For high school seniors who are U.S. residents; have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher; plan to enroll at a two- or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school. James W. McLamore WHOPPER[™] Scholarship also available to those with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.3; demonstrate active leadership role in community service, athletics, and/or similar co-curricular activity; demonstrate substantial work experience. • **DECEMBER 16 – EDISON SCHOLARS** (\$40,000) - for seniors who want to make a difference in the world by studying science, technology, engineering or math (STEM) in college. Requirements for applying include having at least a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale and have financial need. Applications may be found



• JANUARY 3 – GE REAGAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP (up to \$40,000) – for seniors only who demonstrate at school, at the workplace, and within the community the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship; demonstrate strong academic performance; be citizens of the United States. ONLY first 25,000 applications accepted. To apply log onto https://www.reaganfoundation.org/education/scholarship-program/

JANUARY 16 - COOLIDGE SCHOLARSHIP (full-ride for college) – JUNIORS

ONLY who plan to enroll in college in the fall 2021. It can be used by recipients at any accredited U.S. college or university. The main criterion is academic merit. Additionally, it seeks those who are interested in public policy; demonstrate an awareness of the values of President Coolidge; display a sense of service and care for the well-being of others. WHAT: Walking Safety Assessment

Join the Peninsula-wide SRTS team on a walk around your school neighborhood, to identify safety concerns for students walking, biking, or taking transit to/from your school. During the workshop following our walk, we will document your comments and prioritize your concerns.



WHY: Safe Routes to School Plans

Our engineers and planners will incorporate your feedback to develop in frastructure recommendations for streets around your school. Examples of recommendations may include crosswalks, sidewalks, and traffic signal improvements.



WHO: The School Community

We invite all parents and guardians to participate in the Walking Safety Assessment.
