OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES

STUDENT ELECTION WORKER PROGRAM, coordinated by the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk would like to encourage students of 16 years of age or older to volunteer as a student election worker for the upcoming March 3, 2020 Presidential Primary Election. All students who are placed are required to attend a 6-8 hour training session prior to their assignment. Students are expected to be present at the vote center from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm (11 hours) Saturday and Sunday and/or 6:00 am to approximately 9:30 pm (15.5 hours) on Election Day. Students are assigned to a precinct in close proximity to their home or school. In addition to gaining an invaluable learning experience about the democratic process, students receive \$100 each day they serve as an election worker and an additional \$80 bonus for attending a mandatory training class.

Any high school student that meets the following requirements may apply:

- Must be a U.S. Citizen or Legal Permanent Resident AND 16 years of age
- Must be attending a public/private secondary institution
- Must be in good academic standing with a GPA of 2.5 or greater
- Must have teacher and parental consent.

In order to be considered for this program, students must complete the Student Election Worker Program Applications which are available in the College and Career Center. All applications must be returned to Mrs. Hoffman in the College and Career Center no later than Friday, December 13.

- DECEMBER 15 AXA ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP (\$2,500, \$10,000, \$25,000) seniors only; regional/state/national competition; recognizes those who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their activities in school, the community or the workplace. APPLY EARLY, only the first 10,000 applications will be accepted. To apply, log onto https://www.scholarsapply.org/axa-achievement/
- DECEMBER 15 BURGER KING SCHOLARS PROGRAM (Varies) For high school seniors who are U.S. residents; have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher; plan to enroll at a two- or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school. James W. McLamore WHOPPER™ Scholarship also available to those with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.3; demonstrate active leadership role in community service, athletics, and/or similar co-curricular activity; demonstrate substantial work experience. DECEMBER 16 - EDISON SCHOLARS (\$40,000) - for seniors who want to make a difference in the world by studying science, technology, engineering or math (STEM) in college. Requirements for applying include having at least a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale and have financial need. - DECEMBER 31 AYSO JEFF RICKEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (\$2,000) awarded to a college-bound senior who has played soccer in, and given volunteer service to the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO), Region 10. - JANUARY 3 GE REAGAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP (up to \$40,000) for seniors only who demonstrate at school, at the workplace, and within the community the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship; demonstrate strong academic performance; be citizens of the United States. - JANUARY 16 COOLIDGE SCHOLARSHIP (full-ride for college) JUNIORS ONLY who plan to enroll in college in the fall 2021. It can be used by recipients at any accredited U.S. college or university. The main criterion is academic merit. Additionally, it seeks those who are interested in public policy; demonstrate an awareness of the values of President Coolidge; display a sense of service and care for the well-being of others. - JANUARY 31 *ELK'S LEGACY AWARD* (\$4,000) seniors only; any child/grandchild of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2017 is eligible to apply. For the 2019-2020 season - all students must submit their PROOF OF PHYSICAL AND the TWO SWIM EVENTS they choose to swim by December 12th to the Student Store.

Saturday, **December 14** - TRYOUTS - 9am to Noon **January 2020** - TRYOUT date TBA

There are Varsity/JV and FS teams at PV High.

The maximum team limit for the varsity/jv is 20 (20 boys/20 girls) The maximum team limit for the frosh/soph is (23 boys/23 girls)

Swim team is a spring sport and tryouts are in December. Pre-season begins in January and swim season begins in February and ends in mid-May

The tryout date (and a make-up date) will be determined by the coach.
