Capitol Convoy is a unique PTSA program sponsored by the Palos Verdes Peninsula Council of PTAs. The program is designed to acquaint PVPUSD students with advocacy and the legislative process. PVPUSD is the only school district in California that sends a convoy (typically 65-70 people) to Sacramento each year to advocate on various issues pertaining to education and our district. It is a great opportunity for students to gain hands-on experience in civic engagement.

<u>Who Attends?</u> Capitol Convoy is open to students from Palos Verdes High School, Peninsula High School and Rancho Del Mar. Additionally, the Convoy includes PVPUSD parents, teachers/principals from the high school, intermediate, and elementary schools, a School Board member, a District Office administrator and the PVP Council President.

When & Where? Two-day trip to Sacramento on **March 17-18**, 2020 (Tues-Weds). This is an excused absence; students are responsible for all missed school work. There are also three mandatory planning meetings in Feb/March that are required (see dates on application).

Cost? PVHS PTSA will cover the trip costs for PVHS students; this includes airfare, lodging, meals and transportation to/from PVHS and LAX.

Application Due Date? Friday, December 6, 2019

Why Should I Apply? Students will be a part of an exciting two-day trip to the State Capitol and gain a general understanding of both the education issues affecting our district and the legislative process. Students will work together with other students, parents and teachers/administrators. They will be grouped into small teams and have the opportunity to meet with various senators and assemblymembers and their staff to discuss/advocate the selected education issues on behalf of PVPUSD. The trip will also include discussions with expert speakers, a live viewing of the Senate Education Committee meeting, a guided tour of the Capitol Building, and dinner with a State Senator.

Who Should Apply? Students who have a keen interest in government, advocacy, public policy and/or education issues or students who want to learn more about civic engagement. No prior experience is required. Each applicant will be interviewed at PVHS by the PTSA Legislative Representatives and a school administrator in December. Selected students will be notified within 2 weeks.

OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES

STUDENT ELECTION WORKER PROGRAM, coordinated by the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk would like to encourage students of 16 years of age or older to volunteer as a student election worker for the upcoming March 3, 2020 Presidential Primary Election. All students who are placed are required to attend a 6-8 hour training session prior to their assignment. Students are expected to be present at the vote center from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm (11 hours) Saturday and Sunday and/or 6:00 am to approximately 9:30 pm (15.5 hours) on Election Day. Students are assigned to a precinct in close proximity to their home or school. In addition to gaining an invaluable learning experience about the democratic process, students receive \$100 each day they serve as an election worker and an additional \$80 bonus for attending a mandatory training class.

Any high school student that meets the following requirements may apply:

- Must be a U.S. Citizen or Legal Permanent Resident AND 16 years of age
- Must be attending a public/private secondary institution
- Must be in good academic standing with a GPA of 2.5 or greater
- Must have teacher and parental consent.

In order to be considered for this program, students must complete the Student Election Worker Program Applications which are available in the College and Career Center. All applications must be returned to Mrs. Hoffman in the College and Career Center no later than Friday, December 13.

- DECEMBER 15 BURGER KING SCHOLARS PROGRAM (Varies) For high school seniors who are U.S. residents; have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher; plan to enroll at a two- or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school. James W. McLamore WHOPPER™ Scholarship also available to those with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.3; demonstrate active leadership role in community service, athletics, and/or similar co-curricular activity; demonstrate substantial work experience. Only the first 50,000 submitted will be processed. To apply, log

DECEMBER 16 - EDISON SCHOLARS (\$40,000) - for seniors who want to make a difference in the world by studying science, technology, engineering or math (STEM) in college. Requirements for applying include having at least a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale and have financial need. - DECEMBER 31 AYSO JEFF RICKEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (\$2,000) awarded to a college-bound senior who has played soccer in, and given volunteer service to the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO), Region 10. Additionally, it seeks those who are interested in public policy; demonstrate an awareness of the values of President Coolidge; display a sense of service and care for the well-being of others. There are Varsity/JV and FS teams at PV High.

The maximum team limit for the varsity/jv is 20 (20 boys/20 girls) The maximum team limit for the frosh/soph is (23 boys/23 girls)

Swim team is a spring sport and tryouts are in December. Pre-season begins in January and swim season begins in February and ends in mid-May

The tryout date (and a make-up date) will be determined by the coach.
