MARCH 22 (extended deadline) - PV JUNIOR WOMEN'S CLUB SCHOLARSHIP (varies) - seniors only; awarded primarily on financial need with a secondary emphasis on academic achievement, community service and extracurricular activities. MARCH 22 (extended deadline) - SEAN HEFFERNAN MEMORIAL (\$1,000) – graduating senior who shows academic achievement, community service; must include original

MARCH 27 - TAIWANESE AMERICAN SCHOLARSHIP FUND (\$2,500) – students must be a high school senior, a U.S. citizen AND a direct blood descendant of a Taiwanese citizen; plan to attend a university in Fall 2019; have an unweighted GPA of 3.0; have a household income at or below the Federal/State/County low income level. MARCH 29 - CCSSM (\$2,000) - seniors only; must submit essay (min 1,000 words) on the following topic: "Pick an experience from your own life and explain how it has influenced your development". MARCH 29 - CCSSM BELVA ROBERTS LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP (\$2,000) – candidates must be high school senior applying to be a full-time student at an accredited college/university in fall 2018. Preference will be given to those that have an interest in leadership and government relations. Must submit essay on this topic: “Pick an experience from your own life and explain how it has influenced your development” Recipients are selected based on their essay, financial need, extracurricular/community involvement, GPA. MARCH 29 - KINECTA (\$2,000) - seniors only; need to submit essay (min 1,000 words) on the following topic: "Pick an experience from your own life and explain how it has influenced your development." MARCH 29 - PVFA SCHOLARSHIP (\$1,000) - awards scholarship to a graduating senior whose parent is a member of the Palos Verdes Faculty Association.
