MARCH 29 - CCSSM (\$2,000) - seniors only; must submit essay (min 1,000 words) on the following topic: "Pick an experience from your own life and explain how it has influenced your development". Recipients are selected based on their essay, financial need, extracurricular, community involvement, GPA. To apply log onto <http://www.ccssm.coop/scholarships.php> .

MARCH 29 - CCSSM BELVA ROBERTS LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP (\$2,000) – candidates must be high school senior applying to be a full-time student at an accredited college/university in fall 2018. Preference will be given to those that have an interest in leadership and government relations. Must submit essay on this topic: "Pick an experience from your own life and explain how it has influenced your development" Recipients are selected based on their essay, financial need, extracurricular/community involvement, GPA. MARCH 29 - KINECTA (\$2,000) - seniors only; need to submit essay (min 1,000 words) on the following topic: "Pick an experience from your own life and explain how it has influenced your development."
