

OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES

2019 LA BioMed SUMMER FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM provides LA County **graduating high school seniors and high school juniors** the opportunity to work in a biomedical research environment. Selected students will spend eight weeks assisting their assigned mentors, who are accomplished medical scientists involved in cutting edge biomedical research. **Fellowships begin on Monday, June 17th, 2019 and continue through Friday, August 9th, 2019**. Students will work full time and receive a total stipend of \$2,200. Students will be selected on the basis of merit.

GIRLS WHO CODE is a free introductory summer immersion computer science program for girls going into their junior or senior year of high school. During a seven week program, participants learn about computer science, gain exposure to tech jobs, and join a national sisterhood of girls who are using computer science to become change-makers. This program is hosted at major tech companies across the United States, so girls get a firsthand look at what it's like to work in computing and are able to envision their own futures in this field. USC LAWRENCE ELLISON INSTITUTE for TRANSFORMATIVE MEDICINE is a free summer program to foster scientific achievement for rising high school seniors interested in clinical or research oncology. This program attempts to foster scientific education by incorporating hands-on experimentation in a collaborative environment. **Applications will be accepted through April 5, 2019.** The program will begin on June 11th and requires the students to commit 6 hours each weekday until June 28th at the Health Science Campus of USC. ONIZUKA SPACE SCIENCE DAY will take place on Saturday, March 9, at El Camino College. The day is designed for serious-minded science students in grades 5 through 12. The whole event is FREE – including lunch for the first 900 students. This year's featured NASA Astronaut is Stanley Glen Love. Love completed his first spaceflight in 2008 to deliver the Columbus laboratory module to the International Space Station and install it there, logging more than 306 hours in space, including 2 spacewalks. ✓ MARCH 13 - JACK BAGDASAR (\$500) — awarded to a senior who demonstrates the ability and desire to be an elementary school teacher. Applications may be downloaded from Naviance

- ✓ **MARCH 15** *CABRILLO CIVIC CLUBS OF CA* (\$500) -seniors only; must be of Portuguese descent; minimum weighted GPA of 3.5; participated in three extracurricular activities. To apply log onto http://www.cabrillocivicclubs.org/scholarship.asp. Applications may also be downloaded from Naviance.
- ✓ MARCH 15 ELK'S STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES SCHOLARSHIP (\$1,000-\$3,000) to be eligible to apply, individuals must be a U.S. citizen; be a resident of CA or HI; have a physical, neurological, visual, hearing and/or speech/language impairment; and be a senior in high school. Funds are to be used for undergraduate work. Selection criteria is based on the following: severity of disability, financial need, GPA, seriousness of purpose and depth of character. - ✓ MARCH 15 ITALIAN CATHOLIC FEDERATION (up to \$2,500) seniors only; must be of Italian ancestry and also Roman Catholic; minimum unweighted GPA of 3.2; participation in extracurricular activities; financial need. To apply log onto www.icf.org. Applications may also be downloaded from Naviance.
- ✓ MARCH 15 PANHELLENIC ALUMNAE SOUTH BAY ASSOCATION (\$1,000) for female seniors only who will be attending a 4 year college or university where sororities are established; must demonstrate academic excellence, demonstrate character, participation in school/community, and financial need. To apply log onto www.SouthBayPanhellenic.com. Applications may also be downloaded from Naviance.
- ✓ MARCH 15 PEF SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (\$1,500) —seniors only; must be currently enrolled in the PVPUSD and maintained enrollment for two years prior to graduation; need to write a maximum 500 word essay on the following topic "How has PEF funding enhanced students' educational experience?"
