IndieFlix Shines the Light on Anxiety with Must-See Documentary, “ANGST: RAISING AWARENESS AROUND ANXIETY”

NEW FILM CREATED TO START COMMUNITY CONVERSATIONS ABOUT ANXIETY & PROVIDE TOOLS, RESOURCES & HOPE SCREENS ON

Wednesday 5/1 at 6pm in the OAR.

IndieFlix, a leading independent online streaming platform, along with its non-profit arm, the IndieFlix Foundation, is sparking a global conversation about anxiety through screenings of its brand-new documentary, “**Angst: Raising Awareness Around Anxiety**”. On **Wednesday 5/1, Palos Verdes High School** will hold a special screening of the documentary in the **OAR** to open up a dialogue between local families, community leaders and experts. The event will feature a viewing of the 56-minute film, followed by an **informative panel discussion**, led by **PVHS Student Support Specialists Nancy de la Rosa and Kelli Washington**, in collaboration with **Mindful Studies Teachers Jill Moeller and Tammi Sheridan**.

Producers Scilla Andreen and Karin Gornick have one goal: to start a global conversation and raise awareness around anxiety. Through candid interviews, they utilize the power of film to tell the stories of many kids and teens who discuss their anxiety and its impacts on their lives and relationships, as well as how they’ve found solutions and hope. The film also includes a special interview with Michael Phelps, a mental health advocate and one of the greatest athletes of all-time. In addition, the documentary provides discussions with mental health experts about the causes of anxiety and its sociological effects, along with the help, resources and tools available to address the condition.
