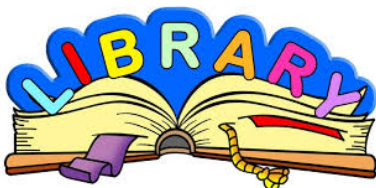

Important Collegeboard Updates for all AP students:

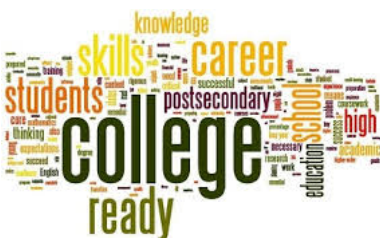
In order for students to register to take AP exams in Spring of 2020, CollegeBoard is requiring students to register an account on their website. Students will be using the same log in information they currently use to register for PSAT, SAT, or to access their AP scores. Once logged on, teachers will give them an access code to "Join" their course. By doing so, students can register for the exam and also will have access to CollegeBoard provided resources. Students will need to provide some information when they enroll in an AP course on CollegeBoard's website including the school they attend and they're current grade level. Through this new system, teachers will have access to a test question bank and the ability to monitor student understanding through online assignments.

More information will be sent out in mid-September with specific registration deadlines, fees, and class join codes.

OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES:

The Congressional App Challenge is a public effort to encourage kids to learn how to code, through district-wide competitions. All middle and high school students that

The 2020 Ignite LA Fellowships are currently open to Los Angeles County high school sophomores and juniors. This opportunity sends students on an all-expenses-paid Earthwatch expedition over the summer to conduct hands-on scientific research in the field at a variety of locations throughout the country. The fellowship looks for students with energy, creativity, and a passion to learn, and is not based on academic performance. Applications are due by December 4. SEPTEMBER 13 – CAMERON IMPACT SCHOLARSHIP (Full Tuition) – seniors only; this organization awards four-year, full-tuition, merit-based undergraduate scholarships to exceptional high school students who have demonstrated excellence in academics, extracurricular activities, leadership, and community service. OCTOBER 31 - COCA COLA SCHOLARS (\$20,000) – this is an achievement-based scholarship awarded to graduating high school seniors. Students are recognized for their capacity to lead and serve, as well as their commitment to making a significant impact on their schools and communities. 150 Coca-Cola Scholars are selected each year to receive this \$20,000 scholarship.
