Attention Seniors: If you applied to four year colleges you may be required to send them a mid year report which includes your first semester senior year grades. The mid year report order form and instructions are now available in the counseling office. You must complete the order form in order to have your mid year report(s) sent. If you are unsure whether your college(s) require a mid year report we recommend checking your application portal or calling the admissions office. Counselors will be sending mid year reports in early February once first semester grades have posted to transcripts. If you have any questions please see your counselor.

4. Certificate of Competency earned for a letter grade of A or B
5. On the job training for many classes, which can lead to job opportunities (ex: Automotive, Emergency Medical Technician, Pharmacy Technician, and Dental Assisting Career Preparation)
6. Great opportunity to try out different career pathways prior to entering college. Choose from classes in Art & Design, Engineering & Design, Finance & Business, Health Sciences or Public & Consumer Services
7. Learn skills pertinent to your college major thus enabling you to have a job relating to your career pathway while going to college
8. We offer a flexible schedule with classes at different times and days. Some classes are 2 days per week or 4 days per week. Times are at 12:45pm, 3:45pm, or 6:45pm

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES and DEADLINES:

Please find below a partial list of scholarships that have deadlines on or before February 15. There are several others that are currently posted on NAVIANCE. Many of the scholarships shown are for SENIORS ONLY. However, there are a several open to ALL STUDENTS, grades 9-12. To access more information on these scholarships, please log onto NAVIANCE. JANUARY 31 - ELK'S LEGACY AWARD (\$4,000) – seniors only; any child/grandchild of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2017 is eligible to apply. FEBRUARY 1 - AL NEUHARTH FREE SPIRIT SCHOLARSHIP –JUNIORS ONLY are encouraged to apply for the 2020, all expense-paid, conference at the Newseum in Washington, D.C. To qualify you must be a high school junior who will graduate in the Class of 2021; be committed to pursuing a career in journalism; demonstrate qualities of a "free spirit". FEBRUARY 1 - CA STATE PTA (\$750) – seniors only; state competition; must be a member of PVHS PTSA in good standing; no minimum GPA; focuses on a student's volunteer service in the school and community. FEBRUARY 5 - COX CARES (up to \$5,000) - seniors only; will enroll in a two or four year college within the U.S.; minimum unweighted GPA of 3.0; must be majoring/pursuing a career in a STEM field, commitment to volunteer service; financial need. FEBRUARY 11 - SANDPIPERS SCHOLARSHIP (varies) - seniors only; minimum unweighted GPA of 3.0; demonstrate financial need; actively involved in community service; scholarship RENEWABLE for each year in college. To apply, log onto <http://app.smarterselect.com/programs/64040-Sandpipers>

FEBRUARY 15 - LOS ANGELES CLIPPERS (\$4,000) – seniors only; regional competition; judged on academic achievement, extracurricular activities, community activities and a 300-word essay on the topic, "Why College is Important to Me". To apply, log onto <https://laclippersfoundation.fluidreview.com>
