
Reasons to take a SoCal ROC class:

The EVE and GENE BLACK SUMMER MEDICAL CAREER PROGRAM is an opportunity best described as a medical mentor program. Students work under the supervision of a health care educator shadowing various medical professionals (nurse, nutritionist, pharmacist, lab technician, and/or physician) who together provide a range of patient care and services. The program accepts applications from high school students who are current 11th and 12th graders AND born ON or BEFORE 4/1/2004. The 2020 program has 2, 3, and 4 week programs. PROGRAM (previously LA BioMed) provides LA County graduating high school seniors and high school juniors the opportunity to explore careers in the field of biomedical science. Selected students will spend eight weeks assisting their assigned mentors, who are accomplished medical scientists involved in cutting edge biomedical research. Fellowships begin on Monday, June 15th, 2020 and continue through Friday, August 7th, 2020. Students will work full time and receive a total stipend of \$2,200. FEBRUARY 15 - *LOS ANGELES CLIPPERS* (\$4,000) – seniors only; regional competition; judged on academic achievement, extracurricular activities, community activities and a 300-word essay on the topic, "Why College is Important to Me". FEBRUARY 21 - SOUTH BAY BUSINESS WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION (\$2,000) – for women who are graduating high school seniors; preferences given to those residing in the South Bay; candidates must be planning to enroll full-time in college in fall 2020; applicants must have a minimum grade point average of 3.0 and show financial need. FEBRUARY 25 - JACK BAGDASAR (\$500) – awarded to a senior who demonstrates the ability and desire to be an elementary school teacher. Applications may be downloaded from <u>Naviance</u>.

FEBRUARY 26 - ASIAN PACIFIC FUND SCHOLARSHIP (\$1,000 - \$20,000) – administers 10 scholarship programs. Many are designated for Asian students with financial need. Eligibility requirements vary from program to program. To apply, log onto www.asianpacificfund.org/scholarships

FEBRUARY 28 - LA MILITARY CHARITABLE CLUB (\$500 - \$2500) - seniors only; must be a child of an active, retired service member or current or retired Dept. of Defense employee; awarded on academic performance, extracurricular activities, demonstrated leadership, and applicant's character. FEBRUARY 28 - PV JUNIOR WOMEN'S CLUB SCHOLARSHIP(varies) -

seniors only; awarded primarily on financial need with a secondary emphasis on academic achievement, community service and extracurricular activities. To apply log onto https://www.pvjuniors.org/scholarships/. Applications may also be downloaded from Naviance.

FEBRUARY 28 - PEF SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (\$1,500) —seniors only; must be currently enrolled in the PVPUSD and maintained enrollment for two years prior to graduation; need to write a maximum 500 word essay on the following topic "How has PEF funding enhanced students' educational experience?" To apply, log onto https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/PEF2020





It's that time of year again...Elections are coming for the PVHS PTSA!
