ONIZUKA SPACE SCIENCE DAY will take place on Saturday, March 7, at El Camino College. The day is designed for serious-minded science students in grades 5 through 12. The whole event is FREE – including lunch for the first 900 students. This year's featured NASA Astronaut is Mark Vande Hei. He was the Flight Engineer for the Expedition crew that launched the International Space Station in 2017. He logged 168 days in space and ventured outside the space station on four spacewalks. 2020 THE LUNDQUIST **INSTITUTE'S** SUMMER **FELLOWSHIP** PROGRAM (previously LA BioMed) provides LA County graduating high school seniors and high school juniors the opportunity to explore careers in the field of biomedical science. Selected students will spend eight weeks assisting their assigned mentors, who are accomplished medical scientists involved in cutting edge biomedical research. Fellowships begin on Monday, June 15th, 2020 and continue through Friday, August 7th, 2020. Students will work full time and receive a total stipend of \$2,200. MARCH 1 - SONS OF ITALY LANGUAGE STUDY GRANT (varies) – seniors only; Italian Language Study Grants are available for a one-month complete immersion summer course in Italian language at an Italian College; applicants must be wholly or partially of Italian Descent; selection based on scholastic record, activities evidencing leadership, financial need, written personal goals statement, essay of Italian Origin, and letters of recommendation.
