**ONIZUKA SPACE SCIENCE DAY** will take place on Saturday, March 7, at El Camino College. The day is designed for serious-minded science students in grades 5 through 12. The whole event is FREE – including lunch for the first 900 students. This year's featured NASA Astronaut is Mark Vande Hei. He was the Flight Engineer for the Expedition crew that launched the International Space Station in 2017. He logged 168 days in space and ventured outside the space station on four spacewalks.
