

Click on the COLLEGES tab and then scroll down to SCHOLARSHIPS and MONEY. Click on SCHOLARSHIP LIST. Then select LOCAL and REGIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS. At this point, choose the scholarship of interest. In many cases, you will be directed to a website for the application. In other instances, you may be able to download the application directly from NAVIANCE. Here are some scholarship opportunities currently listed on Naviance:

JANUARY 20 - COOLIDGE SCHOLARSHIP (full-ride for college) –
 JUNIORS ONLY who plan to enroll in college in the fall 2022. It can be used
 by recipients at any accredited U.S. college or university. The main criterion
 is academic merit. Additionally, it seeks those who are interested in public
 policy; demonstrate an awareness of the values of President Coolidge;

- JANUARY 28 EQUITABLE EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP (\$2,500, \$10,000, \$25,000) – seniors only; regional/state/national competition; recognizes those who have achieved an extraordinary community service accomplishment; criteria also includes academic achievement, leadership, participation in school/community activities and/or the workplace. APPLY EARLY, only the first 10,000 applications will be accepted. - FEBRUARY 1 CA STATE PTA (\$500) seniors only; state competition; must be a member of PVHS PTSA in good standing; no minimum GPA; focuses on a student's volunteer service in the school and community. - FEBRUARY 3 COX CHARITIES SCHOLARSHIP (\$1,000 \$5,000) seniors only who are residents of a Southern California Cox service area; must plan to major in a STEM field; have a minimum unweighted GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale; have a history of active involvement in extracurricular activities, community service, or work experience; have a demonstrated financial need. Candidates who qualify are judged on knowledge, charity, community service and integrity. - MAY 1 SUSAN PAVELKA SCHOLARSHIP FOR JOURNALISTIC EXCELLENCE (\$500) – for a college-bound senior who has participated and excelled in Palos Verdes High School journalism. Candidates are eligible to apply after fulfilling a minimum of two consecutive years as a leader/writer in one or more of these journalism programs: yearbook, literary magazine, newspaper, podcast or broadcast news. Applicants are judged based on leadership, writing and character along with two written entries publications/broadcasts. Applications may be downloaded from Naviance.
