Please make note of the following DEADLINES through early FEBRUARY:

DECEMBER 13th - *EDISON SCHOLARS* (\$40,000) - for seniors who want to make a difference in the world by studying science, technology, engineering or math (STEM) in college. Requirements for applying include having at least a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale and have financial need. For more information and to apply **CLICK HERE**

DECEMBER 15th - *BURGER KING SCHOLARS PROGRAM* (Varies) - For high school seniors who are U.S. residents; have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher; plan to enroll at a two- or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school. James W. McLamore WHOPPER™ Scholarship also available to those with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.5; demonstrate active leadership role in community service, athletics, and/or similar co-curricular activity; demonstrate substantial work experience. DECEMBER 17th – *EQUITABLE EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP* (\$2,500, \$5,000/yr for 4 yrs) – seniors only; recognizes those who have achieved an extraordinary community service accomplishment; criteria also includes academic achievement, leadership, participation in school/community activities and/or the workplace. JANUARY 6th - GE REAGAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP (up to \$40,000) – for seniors only who demonstrate at school, at the workplace, and within the community the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship; demonstrate strong academic performance; be citizens of the United States. JANUARY 19th - COOLIDGE SCHOLARSHIP (full-ride for college) – JUNIORS ONLY who plan to enroll in college in the fall 2023. It can be used by recipients at any accredited U.S. college or university. The main criterion is academic merit. Additionally, it seeks those who are interested in public policy; demonstrate an awareness of the values of President Coolidge; display a sense of service and care for the well-being of others. FEBRUARY 7th - ELK'S LEGACY AWARD (\$4,000 - \$1,000/yr over 4 yrs)— seniors only; any child/grandchild of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2019 is eligible to apply.
