OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES

The EVE and GENE BLACK SUMMER MEDICAL CAREER PROGRAM is an opportunity best described as a medical mentor program. Students work under the supervision of a health care educator shadowing various medical professionals (nurse, nutritionist, pharmacist, lab technician, and/or physician) who together provide a range of patient care and services. The program accepts applications from high school students who are current 11th and 12th graders AND born ON or BEFORE 7/1/2005. Online sessions will take place July 5-15 and July 19 -29. 2020 THE LUNDQUIST INSTITUTE'S SUMMER FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM (previously LA BioMed) provides LA County graduating high school seniors and high school juniors the opportunity to explore careers in the field of biomedical science. Selected students will spend eight weeks assisting their assigned mentors, who are accomplished medical scientists involved in cutting edge biomedical research. Fellowships begin on June 14 and continue through August 6. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the 2021 Summer Fellows Program will continue to be conducted virtually, with an enhanced curriculum of lecture and discussion sessions, followed by small group research projects culminating in a virtual project presentation. - MARCH 12 NATIONAL CHARITY LEAGUE (varies) seniors only; awarded based on financial need, academic performance, and extracurricular activities including community service. Scholarship RENEWABLE for each year in college. Applications may be downloaded from Naviance.
- MARCH 12 PEF SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (\$1,500) -seniors only; must be currently enrolled in the PVPUSD and maintained enrollment for two years prior to graduation; need to write a maximum 500 word essay on the following topic "How has PEF funding enhanced students' educational experience?" - MARCH 12 PVP ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP (\$3,000, \$5,000) seniors only; scholarship, leadership, service, and financial aid are deciding
 factors; will award several scholarships at \$3,000 and one \$5,000 that is

- MARCH 15 CABRILLO CIVIC CLUBS OF CA(\$500) -seniors only; must be of Portuguese descent; minimum weighted GPA of 3.5; participated in three extracurricular activities. To apply, log onto http://www.cabrillocivicclubs.org/scholarship.asp
- MARCH 15 ELK'S STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES SCHOLARSHIP
 (\$1,000-\$3,000) to be eligible to apply, individuals must be a U.S. citizen;

 impairment, visual impairment, hearing impairment, and/or speech/language
 disorder; and be a senior in high school. Funds are to be used for
 undergraduate work. Selection criteria is based on the following: severity of
 disability, financial need, GPA, seriousness of purpose and depth of

- MARCH 15 ITALIAN CATHOLIC FEDERATION (up to \$2,500) seniors only; must be of Italian ancestry and also Roman Catholic; minimum unweighted GPA of 3.2; participation in extracurricular activities; financial need. To apply log onto https://www.icf.org/scholarships/
- MARCH 15 KINECTA SCHOLARSHIPS (\$2,000) seniors only; need to submit essay (min 1,000 words) on "What is one positive outcome that has come form the pandemic for you?"
