OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES

MAKING CARING COMMON'S YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD 2023 is a diverse group of high school students from across the country who are committed to making schools more caring and respectful places through everyday interactions. Members guide our understanding of and help devise solutions to the most pressing moral issues and social challenges of their peer groups, such as bullying and exclusion. The Making Caring Common Project is looking for young people with the following characteristics:

- Passion for making their school and community kinder and more inclusive
- Creativity about ways to connect with young people
- Ability to inspire other youth and adults to action
- · Excellent communication and organization skills
- Demonstrated commitment to the following values: caring, responsibility toward others, and justice

PVP CHAMBER OF COMMERCE YOUNG ENTREPRENEURS ACADEMY is continuing the innovative **Young Entrepreneurs Academy** with programming beginning in February 2023. The PVP Chamber of Commerce will host an informational meeting on **Thursday**, **January 12**, **at lunchtime in the College and Career Center**, **Room 318**.

This is an innovative and exciting after school program that transforms local middle and high school students into real, confident entrepreneurs. Through this program, students in grades 7 - 12 work closely with local business leaders to cultivate and research business ideas, write business plans, pitch to a panel of investors, obtain funding, develop their brand, and launch their business or social movement. By learning entrepreneurial skills before they exit high school, the students develop not only the business and social skills so often attributed to entrepreneurship, but the mindset that will help them achieve success with, and bring innovation to, all their future endeavors.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES and DEADLINES:

Please make note of the following DEADLINES through MARCH 1 noted in RED.

Click on the name of the scholarship for further information and to apply.

DECEMBER 31 - AYSO JEFF RICKEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (\$2,000) - awarded to a college-bound senior who has played soccer in and given volunteer service to the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO), Region 10. Applicant must demonstrate an understanding of the importance of good sportsmanship. Due to revisions to the application this year, it is highly encouraged that students submit their applications SOONER than the midnight deadline on December 31, 2022, in case they have any questions.

JANUARY 5 - *GE REAGAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP* (up to \$40,000) – for seniors only who demonstrate at school, at the workplace, and within the community the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship; demonstrate strong academic performance; be citizens of the United States.

FEBRUARY 1 – *CA STATE PTA* (\$500 - \$1,000) – seniors only; state competition; must be a member of PVHS PTSA in good standing; no minimum GPA; focuses on a student's volunteer service in the school and community.

FEBRUARY 6 - *ELK'S LEGACY AWARD* (\$4,000) – seniors only; any child/grandchild of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1,2020, is eligible to apply. Candidates who qualify are judged on knowledge, charity, community service, and integrity

FEBRUARY 23 - <u>COOLIDGE SCHOLARSHIP</u> (full-ride for college) – **JUNIORS ONLY** who plan to enroll in college in the fall 2024.It can be used by recipients at any accredited U.S. college or university. The main criterion is academic merit. Additionally, it seeks those who are interested in public policy; demonstrate an awareness of the values of President Coolidge; display a sense of service and care for the well-being of others.

FEBRUARY 23 – *MARY P. WYATT SCHOLARSHIP* (\$877) – PVHS seniors only; min 3.0 GPA; demonstrates financial need; actively helps others.

FEBRUARY 28 - LOS ANGELES CHARITABLE FUND SCHOLARSHIP

(Varies) – seniors only; must be a child of an active, retired service member or current or retired Dept. of Defense employee; awarded on academic performance, extracurricular activities, demonstrated leadership, and applicant's character.

MARCH 1 – <u>SONS OF ITALY SCHOLARSHIP</u> (\$500 - \$5,000) – seniors only; must be wholly or partially of Italian Descent; selection based on scholastic record, activities evidencing leadership, financial need, written personal goals statement, essay of Italian Origin, and letters of recommendation.

City of Rancho Palos Verdes Internship Program

The program was designed to attract, develop, and mentor students interested in pursuing a career in local government; while the program's goals allow students to apply, evaluate, test, and integrate academic knowledge and theoretical concepts in a work setting.

New STEM Courses Available PVNet Academy for STEM, nonprofit Technology Center in RHE

Advanced Unity Game Design	This Unity course teaches students with some prior Unity experience how to implement UI controls/menus, fine tuning character motions, as well as incorporating audio/visual effects into 3D games. Course ID: #590
AP Comp Sci Test Prep	For students who are planning on taking the College Board AP Comp Sci A test in May this boot camp prepares you in a small class setting. Mentors will provide the support students need to fully understand concepts that they may not fully understand. Course ID: #588
Arduino Certification Course	Prepare for the Arduino Fundamental Certification exam. This is a key stepping stone to robotics, electronics, computer science, and related fields of study. This course is designed to teach students how to program their own micro-controllers to create a variety of projects. Course ID: #579
Audio/Music Production	Taught by a professional editor/producer, this course will teach students skills using professional software and industry programs/technology. Course ID: #535

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


