OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES

STUDENT ELECTION WORKER PROGRAM coordinated by the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk would like to encourage students of 16 years of age or older to volunteer as a student election worker for the upcoming June 7 Statewide Direct Primary Election. All students who are placed are required to attend two training sessions (one in-person and one online session) prior to their assignment. Participating students will select a 3-day work assignment (one day includes June 7 during FINALS WEEK). Students are assigned to a precinct in close proximity to their home or school. In addition to gaining an invaluable learning experience about the democratic process, students receive \$100 each day they serve as an election worker and an additional \$80 bonus for attending a mandatory training class for a total of \$380. Any high school student that meets the following requirements may apply:

- ·Must be a U.S. Citizen or Legal Permanent Resident AND 16 years of age
- ·Must be attending a public/private secondary institution
- ·Must be in good academic standing with a GPA of 2.5 or greater
- ·Must have teacher AND parental consent

CLASS OF of 2023 & 2024: MEDICAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM: The Osborne Head and Neck Foundation has opened enrollment to their Medical Scholars Program, a 3-week immersive hybrid mentoring and educational course for aspiring physicians. This highly sought-after program is a rare opportunity for high school students to learn from leaders in medicine and gain hands-on experience prior to college in:

- ·Medical school application and interview preparation
- ·Operating room and clinical shadowing
- ·Medical ethics, patient interviewing
- ·Hands-on experiences with suturing, knot tying, and microscopy labs
- ·Grand Rounds training and presentations

APRIL 6 – SILVER SPUR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PTA SCHOLARSHIP (\$1,000) - for Silver Spur alums; community service and extracurricular activities

APRIL 8 - *CALIFORNIA CREDIT UNION* (\$1,000) – graduating high school seniors enrolling in a two or four-year college; must have min GPA of 3.0, community/school involvement.

APRIL 10 – <u>VIETNAM VETERANS SCHOLARSHIP ESSAY</u>(\$1,000) – for seniors; must interview and write an essay on a Vietnam Era Veteran, including a brief biography of the veteran and the most important things you learned from your interview.

APRIL 12 (extended deadline) - <u>KIWANIS CLUB</u> (\$500; \$1,000) – high school seniors only; given to students to have shown special heart, academic merit, service and financial need. Applicants may apply for the merit/leadership option OR merit/leadership/financial aid.

APRIL 14 (extended deadline) – <u>PVP ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP</u> (\$2,000) - seniors only; scholarship, leadership, service, and financial aid are deciding factors; will award multiple scholarships.

APRIL 15 – <u>BETH MURAIDA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP</u> (\$500) – awards 5 scholarships annually to seniors graduating high school in the Southwest SELPA Area with an active IEP or 504 plan. Students must be planning to continue their education. Selection will be based on the student's financial needs, academic merits, and/or exceptional community services.

APRIL 15 – <u>SUSAN PAVELKA SCHOLARSHIP FOR JOUIRNALISTIC</u> <u>EXECELLENCE</u> (\$500) - for a college-bound senior who has participated and excelled in PVHS journalism. Candidates are eligible to apply after fulfilling a minimum of two consecutive years as a leader/writer in one or more of these journalism programs: yearbook, literary magazine, newspaper, podcast or
