Counseling Office Update

Scheduling for the 2022-2023 School Year: You will be receiving your Course

Request Letters in the mail in the coming weeks. Please review these to ensure your course requests for the next school year are correct. Inform your counselor by email or stop by the Counseling Office to correct any errors.

Out-of-District Courses: The deadline to request a summer course outside of the district is Friday, May 27, 2022. **Should your plans to enroll with an outside institution fall through, you must communicate with your counselor to ensure you have a plan for taking the class.** All requests to take a course outside of PVPUSD must be approved in advance by your counselor and no late requests will be honored.

Request for Placement: The deadline to request placement into a class you did not receive recommendation for is Friday, May 27, 2022. Please keep in mind that teacher recommendations are the best indicators of student performance in a course. Should you request to override that recommendation, you must submit your Request for Placement form to your counselor by the deadline. No late forms will be honored.

Seal of Biliteracy

Senior Families - The California State Seal of Biliteracy is an annually run program that recognizes seniors who demonstrate proficiency in English and another World Language. The state uses multiple measures to determine eligibility. Below details information about the state's criteria for the Seal of Biliteracy:

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY	
Must check at least 3 boxes below. ELL students must also check the last box

<input type="checkbox"/>	Score of 660 or above on the 11th grade iReady in English
<input type="checkbox"/>	Complete all English language arts courses required for graduation with an overall GPA of 2.0 or above in those classes; No D's or F's that have not been repeated
<input type="checkbox"/>	*If English Learner, score LEVEL 3 or higher on ELPAC Score: ____
TARGET LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY	
Must check at least one box.	
<input type="checkbox"/>	A) Complete a district four-year high school course of study in the target language with an overall GPA of 3.0. Must be 3.0 in level 4. No D's or F's that have not been repeated
<input type="checkbox"/>	B) Pass the AP World Language or World Literature exam with a score of 3 or higher
<input type="checkbox"/>	C) Pass the SAT Subject Test in the target language with a score of 600 or higher
<input type="checkbox"/>	D) If no AP or SAT II exam exists for the language, student must schedule and pass a comprehensive language assessment approved by the district (for languages that are not taught in PVPUSD schools). Must notify district of test needed by January 15 and must be administered by April 15.

If your student qualifies, they will be awarded a gold seal on their diploma. This information may also be reported to colleges as a measure of strong college and career readiness.

THE CALIFORNIA STATE SEAL OF BILITERACY



What is the State Seal of Biliteracy?
The State Seal of Biliteracy is a recognition by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction for graduating high school students who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing in one or more languages in addition to English. The State Seal of Biliteracy is marked by a gold seal affixed to the diploma or transcript.

What are the requirements for earning the California State Seal of Biliteracy?

English proficiency, demonstrated by:



-  and 
- Completing all English language arts (ELA) graduation requirements with a 2.0 grade point average (GPA) or above.
- Passing the ELA California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress at the 'standard met' level or above.

Second-language proficiency, demonstrated by:


Assessment (choose one) or Coursework

-  Passing an Advanced Placement (AP) exam with a three or above.
-  Passing an International Baccalaureate (IB) exam with a four or above.
-  Passing an SAT II foreign language exam with a 600 or above.
- Or passing a locally approved assessment that meets the rigor of an AP exam and tests all modalities of communication in the language.


Coursework

-  and 
- Completing a four-year high school course of study in the language with a 3.0 GPA or above.
- Demonstrating oral proficiency in the language.

If the student is currently designated as an English learner, also:

-  Demonstrating English proficiency on the English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC) and meeting all other requirements.

OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES

STUDENT ELECTION WORKER PROGRAM coordinated by the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk would like to encourage students of 16 years of age or older to volunteer as a student election worker for the upcoming **June 7 Statewide Direct Primary Election**. All students who are placed are required to attend two training sessions (one in-person and one online session) prior to their assignment. **Participating students will select a 3-day work assignment (one day includes June 7 during FINALS WEEK)**. Students are assigned to a precinct in close proximity to their home or school. In addition to gaining an invaluable learning experience about the democratic process, students receive \$100 each day they serve as an election worker and an additional \$80 bonus for attending a mandatory training class for a total of \$380. Any high school student that meets the following requirements may apply:

- Must be a U.S. Citizen or Legal Permanent Resident AND 16 years of age
- Must be attending a public/private secondary institution
- Must be in good academic standing with a GPA of 2.5 or greater
- Must have teacher AND parental consent

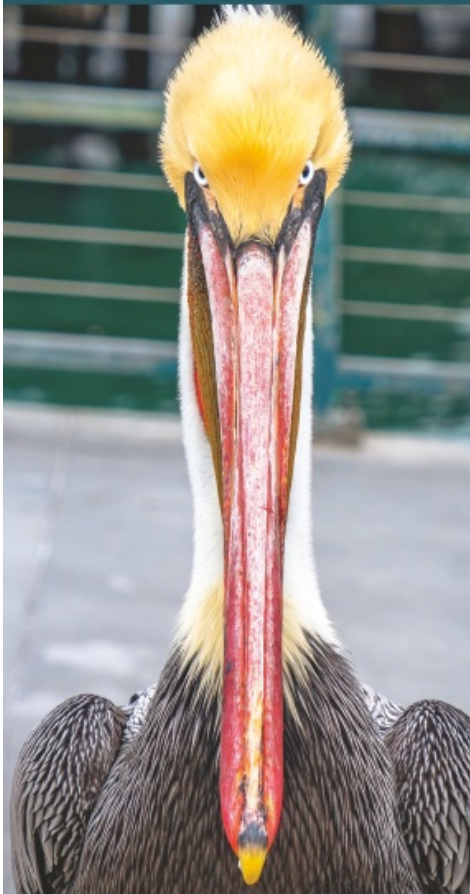

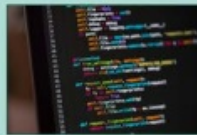
