Also known as the 7th Semester Transcript - Be sure you are checking your email and/or application portals to see if your schools you have applied to have requested that your counselor send a Mid-Year Transcript. This transcript includes grades from fall semester of senior year. To order your mid-year transcript, please click the link below and follow the same steps as you did for ordering your initial transcript in the fall. SchooLinks: It is tremendously helpful and appreciated if you update your SchooLinks portal with the latest on your college application outcomes. Please

The last day to drop or level down in a class this semester without it appearing on your transcript is **Friday**, **February 17th**. The last day to withdraw from a class with a "W" on your transcript is **Friday**, **March 17th**.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES and DEADLINES:

Click on the name of the scholarship for further information and to apply.

FEBRUARY 1 – *CA STATE PTA* (\$500 - \$1,000) – seniors only; state competition; must be a member of PVHS PTSA in good standing; no minimum GPA; focuses on a student's volunteer service in the school and community.

FEBRUARY 2 – <u>SANDPIPERS SCHOLARSHIP</u> (varies) -- seniors only; minimum unweighted GPA of 3.0; demonstrate financial need; actively involved in community service; scholarship RENEWABLE for each year in college.

FEBRUARY 6 - *ELK'S LEGACY AWARD* (\$4,000) – seniors only; any child/grandchild of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2020 is eligible to apply. Candidates who qualify are judged on knowledge, charity, community service, and integrity

FEBRUARY 23 - <u>COOLIDGE SCHOLARSHIP</u> (full-ride for college) – **JUNIORS ONLY** who plan to enroll in college in the fall 2024.It can be used by recipients at any accredited U.S. college or university. The main criterion is academic merit. Additionally, it seeks those who are interested in public policy; demonstrate an awareness of the values of President Coolidge; display a sense

of service and care for the well-being of others.

FEBRUARY 23 – **MARY P. WYATT SCHOLARSHIP** (\$877) – PVHS seniors only; min 3.0 GPA; demonstrates financial need; actively helps others.

FEBRUARY 28 – <u>LOS ANGELES CHARITABLE FUND SCHOLARSHIP</u> (Varies) – seniors only; must be a child of an active, retired service member or current or retired Dept. of Defense employee; awarded on academic performance, extracurricular activities, demonstrated leadership, and applicant's character.

MARCH 1 – **SONS OF ITALY SCHOLARSHIP** (\$500 - \$5,000) – seniors only; must be wholly or partially of Italian Descent; selection based on scholastic record, activities evidencing leadership, financial need, written personal goals statement, essay of Italian Origin, and letters of recommendation.

MARCH 10 – NATIONAL CHARITY LEAGUE STRIVE SCHOLARSHIP (\$1,000 - \$3,000) – - seniors only; awarded based on financial need, academic performance, and extracurricular activities including community service. Scholarship RENEWABLE for each year in college.

MARCH 15 – <u>ELKS UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDENTS</u>
<u>WITH DISABILITES</u> (\$1,000 - \$2,000) - to be eligible to apply, individuals must be a U.S. citizen; be a resident of CA or HI; have a physical impairment, neurological impairment, visual impairment, hearing impairment, and/or speech/language disorder; and be a senior in high school

MARCH 15 – <u>HORATIO ALGER SCHOLARSHIP</u> – JUNIORS ONLY who possess the character to succeed in life including integrity, determination and courage. Criteria include financial need, involvement in community service, GPA of 2.0 or above, be a US Citizen, and plan to attend a 2-year or 4-year college in the US.

MARCH 15 - <u>CABRILLO CIVIC CLUBS OF CA</u> (\$500) - seniors only; must be of Portuguese descent; minimum weighted GPA of 3.5; participated in three extracurricular activities.

MARCH 16 – <u>INTERNATIONAL LONGSHORE WARHEOUSE UNION</u>
<u>SCHOLARSHIP</u> (\$500) - Three scholarships will be awarded to PVHS students; application includes an essay on labor leader Harry Bridges.

MARCH 16 – <u>JACK & ELISA BAGDASAR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP</u> (\$500) – awarded to a senior who demonstrates the ability and desire to be an elementary/middle/high school teacher.

MARCH 19 – <u>PVP COUNCIL FOR PTAs SCHOLARSHIP</u> (\$1,000) - seniors only; MUST be a PTSA member and complete the essay question: "Describe the role PTA has played in supporting and enriching you K-12 education."

MARCH 23 – *PV PENINSULA LIONS CLUB* (\$500 - \$1,000) - seniors only; consideration will be given to academic achievement (min. GPA of 3.0), service to others, leadership, financial need and a strong desire/plan for further education/professional focus.

MARCH 24 – <u>PANHELLENIC ALUMNAE SOUTH BAY HIGH SCHOOL</u> <u>SCHOLARSHIP</u> (varies) - awarded to female graduates of high schools in the South Bay who plan to attend a four-year institution where sororities are established; must have unweighted 3.5 GPA or higher. Will be judged on academic excellence, character, participation in school and community/cultural activities, and financial need. Once on their website, be sure to download the application for high school scholarship.

MARCH 24 – <u>SUSAN PAVELKA SCHOLARSHIP FOR JOURNALISTIC</u> <u>EXECELLENCE</u> (\$500) - for a college-bound senior who has participated and excelled in PVHS journalism. Candidates are eligible to apply after fulfilling a minimum of two consecutive years as a leader/writer in one or more of these journalism programs: yearbook, literary magazine, newspaper, podcast or broadcast news.

MARCH 31 – RH/PV ALUMNAE CHAPTER OF DELTA SIGMA THETA SORORITY SCHOLARSHIP - for seniors who are of African-American ancestry and made a positive contribution to school/community.

APRIL 1 – <u>ITALIAN CATHOLIC FEDERATION FIRST YEAR SCHOLARSHIP</u> (\$400 - \$2,500) – seniors only; must be of Italian ancestry and Roman Catholic; minimum unweighted GPA of 3.2; participation in extracurricular activities; financial need.

APRIL 1 – <u>SOUTH BAY JAPANESE AMERICAN CITIZEN LEAGUE</u> (Varies) – Scholarships are open to all students of Japanese American ancestry residing in the South Bay JACL Chapter area and a member of the JACL. Students are required to fill out only one application for the scholarships listed below. The committee will select the recipients for each of the scholarships based upon the requirements:

Kiichi Egashira Memorial Scholarship - for students pursuing a bachelor's degree in physical and biological sciences, engineering/mathematics. **Janice Kobata Zoeger Memorial Scholarship** - for students in pursuit of a bachelor's in any field of study relating to biological sciences, foreign and/or ancient language or business.

Ernest K. Tsujimoto Memorial Scholarship - for students in pursuit of an undergraduate degree majoring in the STEM fields

Gardena Valley Japanese American Citizens League Scholarship - for students pursuing a bachelor's degree in any field of study.
