
New This Week!

PVPSS Costa Rica Program

Are you interested in doing sea turtle and rainforest field research in Costa Rica next summer? The PVPSS Summer Program is proud to once again offer field research as a summer school offering for Science Research credits.

Students will experience "pura vida" and broaden their world view in this "sea-to-mountains" immersive experience. Students will monitor and patrol sea turtle nests, conduct observational studies of rainforest flora and fauna as well as experience ziplining, horseback riding and a deep dive into the rich biodiversity of the region.



COLLEGE CAREER CENTER UPDATES & EVENTS:

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NAVIGATING COLLEGE ADMISSION TESTING presentation will take place on Thursday, November 30, 6:30 – 7:30 pm in the OAR (Drama Room). This event is targeted for our junior and sophomore classes/parents. With Practice PSAT and Official PSAT/NMSQT results in hand by mid-November, parents will more than likely be interested in learning practical, usable information about standardized testing and college admissions. Please join Joanne Lewis, Director of the PVHS College Career Center and Torsten Sannar, Managing Director of Compass Education Group, as they lead a thoughtful and pragmatic discussion of college admission testing and the outcomes and unpredicted "silver linings" of the test optional movement.

Outside Opportunities:

ASIAN PACIFIC YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROJECT (APYLP): offers leadership conferences for Asian Pacific youth in the state of California interested in developing their leadership potential and pursuing active community and public service. Fifty JUNIOR and SENIORS will be selected from the statewide application to participate in this conference from March 21–24, 2024 in Sacramento. The APYLP will pay all expenses for the participants including travel, lodging, and meal expenses. Applications must be submitted no later than December 2. STUDENT ELECTION WORKER PROGRAM coordinated by the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk would like to encourage students of 16 years of age or older to volunteer as a student election worker for the upcoming March 5 Presidential Primary Election. All students who are placed are required to attend two training sessions (one inperson and one online session) prior to their assignment. All students who are placed will be given the following 3-day assignment:

• Saturday, March 2: 9 am – 8 pm

• Sunday, March 3: 9 am – 8 pm

• Tuesday, March 5: 6 am – 9 pm

Students are assigned to a precinct in close proximity to their home or school. Participating students earn a stipend up to \$380 (\$480 if bilingual) along with hands on experience with the democratic process. Any high school student that meets the following requirements may apply:

 \cdot Must be a U.S. Citizen or Legal Permanent Resident AND 16 years of age

- Must be attending a public/private secondary institution
- \cdot Must be in good academic standing with a GPA of 2.5 or greater
- Must have teacher AND parental consent

LOS SERENOS DE POINT VICENTE JUNIOR DOCENTS PROGRAM is

open to local high school students. The program is designed to complement the existing educational and support activities including museum tours, hikes support, whale wagon duty and special event participation. If you are interested in becoming a Junior Docent, learn more about the program and how to apply <u>HERE</u>. Applications are accepted until December 31; it is best to apply early as positions fill up quickly.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES and DEADLINES:

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DECEMBER 31 - AYSO JEFF RICKEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

(\$2,000) - awarded to a college-bound senior who has played soccer in, and given volunteer service to the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO), Region 10. Applicant must demonstrate an understanding of the importance of good sportsmanship.

JANUARY 4 - <u>GE REAGAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP (up to</u> <u>\$40,000)</u> – for seniors only who demonstrate at school, at the workplace, and within the community the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship; demonstrate strong academic performance; be citizens of the United States.

JANUARY 23 - EDISON SCHOLARS (\$50,000) - for seniors who want to make a difference in the world by studying science, technology, engineering or math (STEM) in college. Requirements for applying include having at least a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale and show financial need.

FEBRUARY 5 - <u>ELK'S LEGACY AWARD</u> (\$4,000) – seniors only; any child/grandchild of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2020, is eligible to apply. Candidates who qualify are judged on knowledge, charity, community service, and integrity.

FEBRUARY 29 – <u>MARY P. WYATT SCHOLARSHIP (\$865)</u> – PVHS seniors only; min 3.0 GPA; demonstrates financial need; actively helps others.

MARCH 1 – <u>SONS OF ITALY SCHOLARSHIP (\$500 - \$5,000)</u> – seniors only; must be wholly or partially of Italian Descent; selection based on scholastic record, activities evidencing leadership, financial need, written personal goals statement, essay of Italian Origin, and letters of recommendation.

MARCH 7 – PERRAULT FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP (\$930) - awarded to a senior, male or female, who has been a member of the PVHS Varsity Soccer Team during their senior year. Criteria includes leadership, commitment to the sport and academic achievement. Preference given to soccer players who have played defensive positions.

MARCH 20 – PV PENINSULA LIONS CLUB (\$500 - \$1,000) - seniors only; consideration will be given to academic achievement (min. GPA of 3.0), service to others, leadership, financial need and a strong desire/plan for further education/professional focus.

MARCH 22 –<u>SUSAN PAVELKA SCHOLARSHIP FOR</u> <u>JOUIRNALISTIC EXECELLENCE (\$500)</u> - for a college-bound senior who has participated and excelled in PVHS journalism. Candidates are eligible to apply after fulfilling a minimum of two consecutive years as a leader/writer in one or more of these journalism programs: yearbook, literary magazine, newspaper, podcast or broadcast news.

2024 Asian Pacific Youth Leadership Project

I am requesting your help informing your students about an opportunity to attend a statewide conference sponsored by the Asian Pacific Youth Leadership Project (APYLP), a nonprofit organization.

The APYLP works with Asian and Pacific Islander students in California to build on their understanding of what it means to be Asian and Pacific Islander American youth in today's culturally and ethnically diverse society. The APYLP High School Conference offers group workshops on leadership development, cultural identity and awareness, the legislative process, and public speaking skills as well as an opportunity to participate in mock legislative sessions and to hear from elected officials and prominent speakers from the Asian and Pacific Islander communities.

Fifty juniors and seniors will be selected from the statewide applicants to participate in this conference from March 21–24, 2024, in Sacramento. The APYLP will pay all expenses for the participants, including travel, lodging, and meal expenses, through sponsorships from private corporations, higher education institutions, professional organizations, and other individuals.

The organization is especially interested in reaching students who have leadership potential but have difficulty developing or realizing that potential due to language, economic, cultural, or other barriers. Applications must be submitted or postmarked no later than December 2, 2023.






Join us for a free movie screening of "Screenagers: Under the Influence"

Proposition 28 Survey

The proposition aims to provide approximately \$1 billion annually to California public schools to enhance arts and music programming for students from pre-K through 12th grade. For PVPUSD, the estimated allocation for the 2023-24 year is \$1.2 million, which is projected to arrive in March. 
