High School Naturalist Internship

Through this program, high school students volunteer in both George F Canyon Nature Center and White Point Nature Education Center as well as in the adjacent Nature Preserves. Interns shadow PVPLC Nature Center Staff to assist with greeting visitors, facilitating programs, community science projects, trail monitoring, animal care and facility maintenance. Interns also receive a checklist of enrichment requirements including reading and activities that they complete to round out their knowledge during their internship. This is an unpaid internship and interns must be age 16 or above when they start. Interns are required to complete 25 hours of shifts and enrichments to complete this program. Applications can be completed online, and competitive applicants will

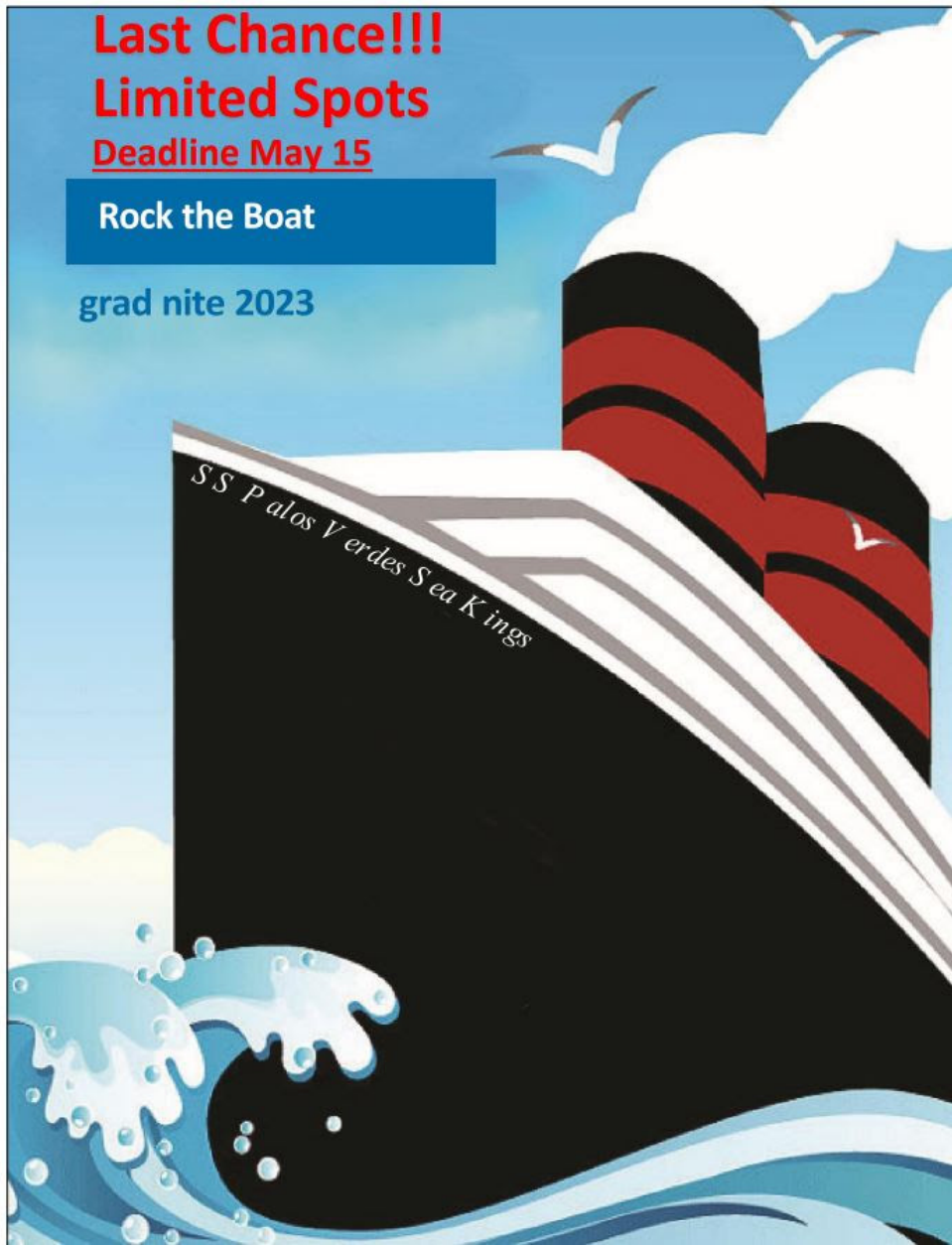

HUMANITY: We respect life and liberty. We are sensitive and inclusive, treating everyone with dignity and compassion.

INTEGRITY: We are guided by the principles of justice. We employ the highest ethical standard, we demand accountability, consistency, fairness and honesty in the performance of our duties.

PROFESSIONALISM: We take pride in our department. We are committed to excellence in our profession, and we maintain the highest standard of education in our field.

COURAGE: We hold a mental and moral strength to resist opposition and maintain fairness of mind. We always stand by your fellow officers in the face of danger or extreme difficulty. Our position duties are inclusive of all required tasks.

Duties of a Police Officer:

- Protects life and property through the enforcement of laws & regulations
- Proactively patrols assigned areas
- Responds to calls for police service
- Conducts preliminary and follow-up criminal and traffic investigations
- Conducts interviews
- Prepares written reports and field notes of investigations and patrol activities
- Arrests and processes criminals
- Testifies in court
- Emergency duties required during adverse weather conditions
- Ability to exercise judgment in determining when to use force and to what degree
- Operates a law enforcement vehicle under emergency conditions, day or night
- Comprehends legal documents including citations, affidavits and warrants
- Commands emergency personnel at accidents, emergencies and disasters
- Takes an active role in Community-Oriented Policing
- Continues to find new ways to keep our community and families safe

NATIONAL POLICE WEEK

Sunday (May 14) marks the beginning of National Police Week (May 14-20, 2023)

National Police Week in the United States provides a time to come together to recognize the law enforcement officers who lost their lives in the line of duty, as well as a time to honor the officers who serve and protect their communities each and every day.

On October 1, 1962, the United States Congress, in a joint resolution, established a week in May as Police Week. A proclamation signed by President John F. Kennedy officially designated May 15 as Peace Officer Memorial Day—as a way to pay tribute to all local, state and federal law enforcement officers who have been disabled or have died in the line of duty.

During National Police Week, the City of Palos Verdes Estates joins others in recognizing the brave men and women of law enforcement who risk their lives to protect our communities. And, most importantly, we remember our fallen brothers and sisters who so valiantly sacrificed their own lives to ensure the safety of others. The families, agencies and communities of those officers remain in our thoughts and prayers.

Government officials are directed to display the flag of the United States at half-staff on all government buildings on May 15. This is done in recognition of the service given by the men and women who work devotedly and selflessly on behalf of the people of this nation, regardless of the peril or hazard to themselves, and have safeguarded the lives and property of our residents. We thank all the police officers, service officers and PD personnel for their service.

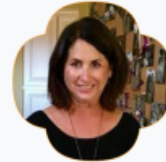
