PVP CHAMBER OF COMMERCE TEEN ENTREPRENEURS PROGRAM
 INFORMATION SESSION will take place on Tuesday, January 16th @ lunch (12:45 to 1:15pm) in the College and Career Center, Room 318.

This is an experiential (**learning by doing**) program where students learn about business by actually developing and launching a real business. Students will learn about all aspects of starting and running a business, including: developing and vetting a business idea; analyzing the market and competition; developing a marketing plan, plus advertising and distribution strategy; developing financial projections; and learning about intellectual property (patents & trademarks), taxes, legal considerations of running a business, permits & licenses, financial record keeping, and more. Students will have the opportunity to pitch their business concept to a panel of judges AND also to sell their product at the PV Street Fair!

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR SENIORS/PARENTS OF SENIORS

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is now available 24/7!

You can apply [HERE](#). Class of 2024 students & parents should read the following information from the U.S. Department of Education/Student Financial Aid: [6 Things Students/Parents Need Before They Fill Out the 2024–25 FAFSA® Form](#). An FSA ID must be obtained before starting the FAFSA. [Create your FSA ID now. CLICK HERE to create an FSA ID](#). Find out [if your parent\(s\) will need to be contributors](#). If your parent(s) need to contribute to your form, make sure EACH contributor creates their own FSA ID.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES and DEADLINES:

JANUARY 23 - EDISON SCHOLARS (\$50,000) - for seniors who want to make a difference in the world by studying science, technology, engineering or math (STEM) in college. Requirements for applying include having at least a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale and show financial need.

FEBRUARY 5 - ELK'S LEGACY AWARD (\$4,000) – seniors only; any child/grandchild of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2020, is eligible to apply. Candidates who qualify are judged on knowledge, charity, community service, and integrity.

FEBRUARY 28 – LOS ANGELES MILITARY CHARITABLE FUND SCHOLARSHIP (Varies) – seniors only; must be a child of an active, retired service member or current or retired Dept. of Defense employee; awarded on academic performance, extracurricular activities, demonstrated leadership, and applicant's character.

FEBRUARY 29 – MARY P. WYATT SCHOLARSHIP (\$865) – PVHS seniors only; min 3.0 GPA; demonstrates financial need; actively helps others.

MARCH 1 – SONS OF ITALY SCHOLARSHIP (\$500 - \$5,000) – seniors only; must be wholly or partially of Italian Descent; selection based on scholastic record, activities evidencing leadership, financial need, written personal goals statement, essay of Italian Origin, and letters of recommendation.

MARCH 7 – PERRAULT FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP (\$930) - awarded to a senior, male or female, who has been a member of the PVHS Varsity Soccer Team during their senior year. Criteria includes leadership, commitment to the sport and academic achievement. Preference given to soccer players who have played defensive positions.

MARCH 20 – PV PENINSULA LIONS CLUB (\$500 - \$1,000) - seniors only; consideration will be given to academic achievement (min. GPA of 3.0), service to others,

leadership, financial need and a strong desire/plan for further education/professional focus.

MARCH 22 – SUSAN PAVELKA SCHOLARSHIP FOR JOURNALISTIC EXCELLENCE (\$500) - for a college-bound senior who has

participated and excelled in PVHS journalism. Candidates are eligible to apply after fulfilling a minimum of two consecutive years as a leader/writer in one or more of these journalism programs: yearbook, literary magazine, newspaper, podcast or broadcast news.

APRIL 1 – SOUTH BAY JAPANESE AMERICAN CITIZEN LEAGUE

(Varies) – Scholarships are open to all high school seniors of Japanese American ancestry residing in the South Bay JAAC Chapter area and a member of the JAAC. Students are required to fill out only one application for the scholarships listed below. The committee will select the recipients for each of the scholarships based upon the requirements:

- Kiichi Egashira Memorial Scholarship - for students pursuing a bachelor's degree in physical and biological sciences, engineering/mathematics.
 - Janice Kobata Zoeger Memorial Scholarship - for students in pursuit of a bachelor's in any field of study relating to biological sciences, foreign and/or ancient language or business.
 - Ernest K. Tsujimoto Memorial Scholarship - for students in pursuit of an undergraduate degree majoring in the STEM fields.
 - Gardena Valley Japanese American Citizens League Scholarship - for students pursuing a bachelor's degree in any field of study.
 - David & Lily Nakatani Scholarships - for high school seniors planning to attend a college or university in pursuit of a bachelor's degree majoring in the STEM fields: Science, Technology, Engineering, or Math
