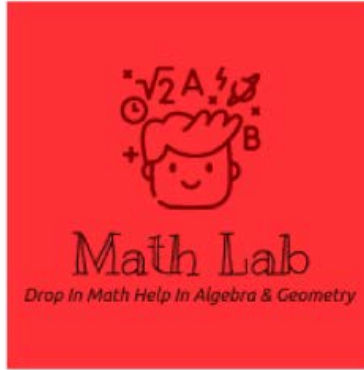

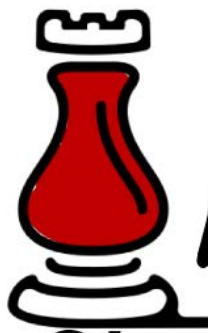

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES and DEADLINES:

FEBRUARY 28 – LOS ANGELES MILITARY CHARITABLE FUND

SCHOLARSHIP (Varies) – seniors only; must be a child of an active, retired service member or current or retired Dept. of Defense employee; awarded on academic performance, extracurricular activities, demonstrated leadership, and applicant's character.

FEBRUARY 29 – MARY P. WYATT SCHOLARSHIP (\$865) – PVHS seniors only; min 3.0 GPA; demonstrates financial need; actively helps others.

MARCH 1 – SONS OF ITALY SCHOLARSHIP (\$500 - \$5,000) – seniors only; must be wholly or partially of Italian Descent; selection based on scholastic record, activities evidencing leadership, financial need, written personal goals statement, essay of Italian Origin, and letters of recommendation.

MARCH 7 – PERRAULT FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP (\$930) - awarded to a senior, male or female, who has been a member of the PVHS Varsity Soccer Team during their senior year. Criteria includes leadership, commitment to the sport and academic achievement. Preference given to soccer players who have played defensive positions.

MARCH 20 – PV PENINSULA LIONS CLUB (\$500 - \$1,000) - seniors only; consideration will be given to academic achievement (min. GPA of 3.0), service to others, leadership, financial need and a strong desire/plan for further education/professional focus.

MARCH 22 – SUSAN PAVELKA SCHOLARSHIP FOR JOURNALISTIC EXCELLENCE (\$500) - for a college-bound senior who has participated and excelled in PVHS journalism. Candidates are eligible to apply after fulfilling a minimum of two consecutive years as a leader/writer in one or more of these journalism programs: yearbook, literary magazine, newspaper, podcast or broadcast news.

APRIL 1 – SOUTH BAY JAPANESE AMERICAN CITIZEN LEAGUE
(Varies) – Scholarships are open to all high school seniors of Japanese American ancestry residing in the South Bay JAACL Chapter area and a member of the JAACL. Students are required to fill out only one application for the scholarships listed below. The committee will select the recipients for each of the scholarships based upon the requirements:
