



### Senior Class of 2024

Ordering Final Transcripts: All seniors are encouraged to order a Final Transcript to be sent to the school they plan to enroll in for the Fall of 2024. You may order your final transcript using Scribbles, which is available <a href="here">here</a>. Please order your final transcript prior to the last day of school, June 6, 2024. All final transcripts will be sent beginning the week of June 17.

Student athletes: You must order a transcript to be sent by your counselor to NCAA if you are playing a sport in college.

Please see your counselor with any questions you may have.

#### Junior Class of 2025:

Junior students received their classroom guidance lessons on May 13, 14, 20 and 21 in English class. The focus is on Finding Your Path. Topics covered include exploring individual values and goals and then using that to begin exploring the right post-secondary path for you. Students were given an overview of two-year, four-year, and other paths including gap-year, vocational, and military options.

Students were given their Junior Handbook at this lesson, and a PDF copy can be found <u>Here.</u>

For students pursuing four-year college after high school, there is much to begin doing now and during the summer before senior year. This includes getting organized, researching schools, working on updating your resume, essays, applications, and the Counselor Letter of Recommendation Questionnaire, which can be found on the Senior Tab.

Please review the Junior Guidance Lesson which has all the above information Here.

Counselors met with the Senior Class of 2024 this past week in their English class to complete their Senior Year End Activity on SchooLinks. This includes updating individual SchooLinks portals with college application outcomes, indicating your enrollment decision, and documenting any scholarship award you received.

If your student was not able to meet with their counselor, it is important to take the time to complete these three tasks. Your information that you provide helps future senior classes with critical data for their college applications.

Please log onto your SchooLinks portal using your Single-Sign On portal.


#### Then:

- 1. Update your College Application outcomes for all schools you applied to. This may include schools not yet inputted on your College Applications list.
- 2. Indicate your Enrollment Decision. This is where you intend to enroll in Fall of 2024.
- 3. After the above two steps are done, go to your home Dashboard and complete the Senior Year End Activity.



Inspired by California Poet Laureate Lee Herrick's "Our California" project, California State Senator Ben Allen is hosting a student photography contest to celebrate our diverse communities and its young creatives.

#### Eligibility and contest guidelines

- Contest is open to students in public, private, or charter middle schools and high schools within Senate District 24 (<u>Click here to see the district's map</u>).
   Homeschooled students are eligible, but must reside within Senate District 24 and in an equivalent grade-level.
- Submitted photos must be of the student's work, but do not need to be a recent work. Only one photo can be submitted per student.
- Each entry must contain a title and all entries must include an artist statement. The
  artist statement communicates what inspired the work, how it relates to the theme,
  and the content of the work. The statement must include at least 50 characters and
  not exceed 600 characters.
- Entries will be reviewed primarily on how well the student uses their artistic vision to
  portray the "Our California, Our Community" theme, their originality and creativity.
   Entries will be "blind juried." They will be evaluated and ranked without the jury
  knowing of the student artist.
- Winning entrees will be printed and displayed at our Capitol and/or District offices and showcased on social media and on our
- Ownership in any submission will remain the property of the student, but entry into this program constitutes entrant's permission and consent to display and promote the photo. The entrant will always be credited (and celebrated!). Use of any copyrighted work not belonging to the entrant is prohibited.
