


CSF Spring Membership Drive is now open and runs through Wednesday, February 5

Math Lab is Free Peer Math Tutoring during lunch.

Who can attend? Any student can attend Math Lab! Math Lab provides drop-in tutoring, and students can bring homework, study guides, or any other materials they want to work with a tutor one-on-one. Once a student comes in the door, one of the staff gets them partnered with an appropriate tutor.

Who are the tutors? Math Lab Tutors apply and are selected from high level math classes, including AP Calculus BC, AP Calculus BC, AP Statistics, and PreCalculus Honors. Once selected, each tutor must attend at least 70% of Math Labs sessions at lunch. If they do, they are able to add "Peer Tutor" to their transcript.

Other benefits are there from Math Lab? All non-honors/AP math teachers, are offering <u>one 1 extra credit point for every</u> <u>Math Lab attended.</u> These classes are listed below:

This semester, PVHS is proud to offer more support for our students in Spanish! Based on the same model as Math Lab,

students can receive free drop-in tutoring at lunch!

How does it work? Any student can attend Spanish Lab! Students looking to be tutored in Spanish can bring homework, study guides, or any other materials they want to work with a tutor one-on-one. Once a student comes in the door, one of the staff gets them partnered with an appropriate tutor.

Who are the tutors? Spanish Lab Tutors apply and are selected from high level Spanish classes, including Spanish AP Language, Spanish AP Literature, Spanish 4 and Spanish 5. Once selected, each tutor must attend at least 70% of Spanish Labs sessions at lunch. If they do, they are able to add "Peer Tutor" to their transcript.

Other benefits are there from Spanish Lab? All Spanish 1 and Spanish 2 teachers, are offering <u>one 1 extra credit point for</u> <u>every Spanish Lab attended.</u>



Adult Judges Needed for the 2025 HIGH SCHOOL Palos Verdes Peninsula Science and Engineering Fair (PVPSEF)!







Junior Class of 2026: Your Junior Guidance Lessons are being held Monday, 1/27 and Tuesday, 1/28 during English class. You will have the opportunity meet with a counselor and Mrs. Lewis in the College and Career Center for introductory dialogue on postsecondary research and planning. Students will receive an overview of two-year, four-year, and other paths including gap-year, vocational, and military options. A strong emphasis will be communicated that time is of essence when it comes to determining college fit, building a college list, visiting schools, and more as well as discussing opportunities for students not planning to apply to four year schools. Attention Senior Class of 2025: As you may begin to hear from colleges you've applied to or been accepted to, these schools may be requesting your Mid-Year Transcript, also known as your 7th Semester Transcript. These are your grades from this past fall 2024 semester. You will need to order these on Scribbles and may find the link here.

Your counselor will begin to send these once transcripts have been reviewed.

All current PVHS families will soon receive in the mail information regarding Course Selection for the 2025-2026 School Year. This information will include a letter entailing your student's next course in sequence, instructions, and a Scheduling Worksheet. Please note these important dates:

- January 23-February 6: Aeries Student Portal is open for students to input their course requests
- February 7: Students must turn in their Scheduling Worksheet to the Counseling Office
- Students will meet with their counselor to discuss their course requests on the following dates during English class:
 - February 10, 11, & 13: Current Juniors
 - February 18-21: Current Freshmen
 - March 17, 19, & 20 Current Sophomores

Class of 2027 Sophomore Counseling

As your student will be entering junior year next year, they are reaching the halfway point in their education at PVHS! The PVHS Counseling Department feels this is the perfect time to meet with our students and their parents/guardians to review high school graduation requirements and postsecondary options, and plan out the next two years of your student's course schedule to fit the needs and aspirations of your student. Given this, we would like to invite all of our sophomore families to schedule a time to meet individually with your student's courselor to participate in a 15-minute meeting, to discuss your student's four-year plan, postsecondary options, introduction to college and career planning, as well as answer any questions your family may have.

Sophomore Counseling begins by attending a Sophomore Family Presentation on February 6, 2025. On this date, we will be giving an in-person presentation in the morning(9:00am) in the MPR and evening Webinar presentation(6:00pm) that covers the same material. Following the evening presentation, a link will be posted for you to schedule a meeting with your student's counselor.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES and DEADLINES:

JANUARY 23 - EDISON SCHOLARS (\$50,000) - for seniors who want to make a difference in the world by studying science, technology, engineering or math (STEM) in college. Requirements for applying include having at least a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale and show financial need ·

FEBRUARY 5 - ELK'S LEGACY AWARD (\$4,000) – seniors only; any child/grandchild of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2022 is eligible to apply. Candidates who qualify are judged on knowledge, charity, community service, and integrity.

OUTSIDE OPPORTUNITIES:

Princeton Summer Journalism Program:

PSJP exists to bridge pathways for students from historically underrepresented backgrounds to journalism and other fields that shape our democracy. During this summer intensive, we expose students to the range of opportunities available in the field of journalism, introduce them to the basic skills they need to report for their own newspaper and produce a short documentary, take them to visit major news outlets in NYC, and present different perspectives about the kinds of post-secondary preparation required for the work.

After they leave campus, students are paired with a college counselor and professional journalist who helps guide them through the admissions process to selective colleges and universities.




