

Thank you for your interest in Palos Verdes Baseball.

We will be holding two separate tryouts this fall, one for 9th graders and one for 10th-12th graders.

We will be holding freshmen baseball tryouts for our program on Wednesday, November 12, through Friday, November 14, with Saturday, November 15, reserved in case of any weather or scheduling issues. Tryouts will take place after school on the baseball field.

Sophomores, Juniors, and Seniors will try out on Monday, November 10th. Tryouts will take place after school on the baseball field. Wednesday, November 1,2, through Friday, November 14, will be reserved in case of any weather or scheduling issues.

We've scheduled tryouts from 3:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m., though we do not anticipate using the full two hours each day.

If you are unable to attend or participate in tryouts due to travel or injury, please contact me in advance to let me know. My classroom is Room 309.

If you are a fall athlete still competing on the varsity level of your sport, please do not attend baseball tryouts until your current season has officially concluded. This typically applies to football players called up to varsity for playoffs.

If you are a winter athlete, you have two options:

- 1. Arrange with your winter sports coach to try out for baseball.
- 2. Try out at the conclusion of your winter season (early February).

Reminders:

Dress to play the game of baseball: hat, baseball pants, and all necessary equipment (glove, bat, and any position-specific gear).

- · Expect to throw, hit, run, and pitch (if applicable).
- · Players who make the team should expect practices and games over Spring Break.

We currently have 36 students who have expressed interest in trying out, and that number usually grows by the actual tryout date. Please note that with this many students trying out, unfortunately, not all will be selected for the team. We encourage all players to give their best effort and to view the tryout process as an opportunity to grow and compete.



For <u>SENIORS</u> in our <u>CLASS OF 2026</u>, this is an amazing opportunity to take a full length practice ACT before the <u>last official ACT</u> in <u>December</u> this year. There are universities like the <u>University of Tennessee</u>, <u>Mississippi and Mizzou</u> that will reconsider merit scholarship when higher scores are submitted even after a student has been admitted. There is also opportunity to increase your ACT score to submit with RD applications.

For <u>JUNIORS</u> in our <u>CLASS OF 2027</u>... now that our juniors have taken the PSAT and received their scores, its a wonderful time to take a practice ACT to compare how they felt taking each exam and compare how they scored.

The test results are invaluable in helping students and their families understand which test might suit the student best and as well assist in determining whether or not to pursue any standardized testing at all!

Many families will attempt both tests in order to be thorough in their planning.

peak in the summer and fall but can be seen at any time of the year. For the well-being of all our school community, please keep your student at home if your student is too sick to come to school. Please review Guidance for Symptoms and When to Stay Home on the district website.



This document is intended to support decision-making for schools and childcare centers when an individual child is displaying signs and symptoms of illness.

Below are suggestions for when to keep your child home when they are not feeling well. Contact a health care provider if your child needs medical care. A doctor's note is generally not required to return to school or child care. For more information, please visit the CDPH guidance page.

This document:

- does not replace the advice of a licensed healthcare provider, nor does it revise guidance related to an
 individual child's known medical condition or existing IEP, Section 504 plan, or IFSP plan.
- is not a diagnostic tool. Related symptoms may inform exclusion decisions, but school staff should not attempt
 to diagnose.
- . does not replace or revise applicable laws or other requirements.
- does not address specific disease outbreaks, when recommendations and public health requirements for exclusion may be more strict.
- is limited to consideration of symptoms as evidence of infection, and does not include considerations for other
 causes of symptoms such as allergies, toxin exposure, and child abuse or neglect.
- should be used within the context of an individual student's health and behavior history.

Symptom	When should my child stay home and when can they return?			
Overall, not feeling well	STAY HOME IF any new illness or symptom prevents a child from participating meaningfully in routine activities.			
	Please note that a child with multiple symptoms is more likely to be contagious. Recommendations for all applicable symptoms should be considered.			
	STAY HOME IF a fever is 100.4°F (38°C) or higher.			
Fever	RETURN WHEN fever went away over the night and is gone in the morning without the use of medications such as Tylenol ^o , Advil ^e , or Motrin ^e (acetaminophen or ibuprofen). If fever is accompanied by additional symptoms, follow all symptomspecific guidelines.			
Respiratory Virus Symptoms (cough, stuffy / runny nose, sneeze)	OK TO ATTEND WITH MILD SYMPTOMS. Children should test for COVID-19 before attending school, wear a mask for 10 days from symptom onset, and follow COVID-19 guidance.			
	STAY HOME IF symptoms are accompanied by fever or if child has significant nasal discharge (ie. interfering with their ability to participate in school and/or can't be contained without contaminating other children or staff).			
	SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION for severe symptoms, including a bad cough, difficulty breathing or trouble catching their breath, or wheezing when not controlled by medication (like albuterol).			
	RETURN WHEN child has been been fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication and other symptoms are improving.






