


COUNSELING

Junior Class of 2026: The **Junior Parent Presentation Part 2** will take place on **Wednesday, April 2**. We invite all parents and guardians for an overview of summer preparation and plans for their rising senior students, the college application platforms, essay writing, teacher and

counselor letter of recommendation process, and more. We will also share opportunities for students who have plans that do not include four-year college. The summer before senior year is an important time for organization and preparation.

There are two opportunities to attend this presentation: **9am in the PVHS MPR** or via **Webinar at 6pm** (registration is required by clicking <u>here</u>). See you there!



Math Lab is Free Peer Math Tutoring during lunch in room 407.

Who can attend? Any student can attend Math Lab! Math Lab provides drop-in tutoring, and students can bring homework, study guides, or any other materials they want to work with a tutor one-on-one. Once a student comes in the door, one of the staff gets them partnered with an appropriate tutor.

Who are the tutors? Math Lab Tutors apply and are selected from high level math classes, including AP Calculus BC, AP Calculus AB, AP Statistics, and PreCalculus Honors. Once selected, each tutor must attend at least 70% of Math Labs sessions at lunch. If they do, they are able to add "Peer Tutor" to their transcript.

Other benefits are there from Math Lab? All non-honors/AP math teachers, are offering <u>one 1 extra credit point for every Math Lab attended.</u> These classes are listed below:

- Algebra 1
- Geometry
- Algebra 2
- Pre Calc
- Pre Calc with Limits
- Statistics

Introducing... Spanish Lab!

This semester, PVHS is proud to offer more support for our students in Spanish! Based on the same model as Math Lab, students can receive free drop-in tutoring at lunch!

How does it work? Any student can attend Spanish Lab! Students looking to be tutored in Spanish can bring homework, study guides, or any other materials they want to work with a tutor one-on-one. Once a student comes in the door, one of the staff gets them partnered with an appropriate tutor.

Who are the tutors? Spanish Lab Tutors apply and are selected from high level Spanish classes, including Spanish AP Language, Spanish AP Literature, Spanish 4 and Spanish 5. Once selected, each tutor must attend at least 70% of Spanish Labs sessions at lunch. If they do, they are able to add "Peer Tutor" to their transcript.

Other benefits are there from Spanish Lab? All Spanish 1 and Spanish 2 teachers, are offering one 1 extra credit point for every Spanish Lab attended.





Montclair State University is pleased to announce that they will be opening their **Early Bird Junior Admission Program** on April 15, 2025!

Designed to give high school juniors the opportunity to get a jump start on their college search and apply for admission before their senior year even begins, the **Early Bird Program is non-binding and the first of its kind.**

How does it work? Interested juniors may apply between April 15 - June 15, 2025, for admission to Montclair's Fall 2026 class. Montclair requires a copy of a students high school transcript that includes junior year grades through the second marking period to be received by June 20th. Students who are admitted are guaranteed admission to the university for Fall 2026. Decisions will be released by July 15, 2025.

What about scholarships? Students who are eligible for a merit scholarship will be informed of their award as part of the Early Bird process.

Can students who are denied Junior Admission apply again for regular admission? Early Bird applicants who are not admissible over the summer will be deferred and reviewed again during the academic year. Those students will be encouraged to have updated grades sent in the fall or winter of their senior year before their application is re-reviewed.


