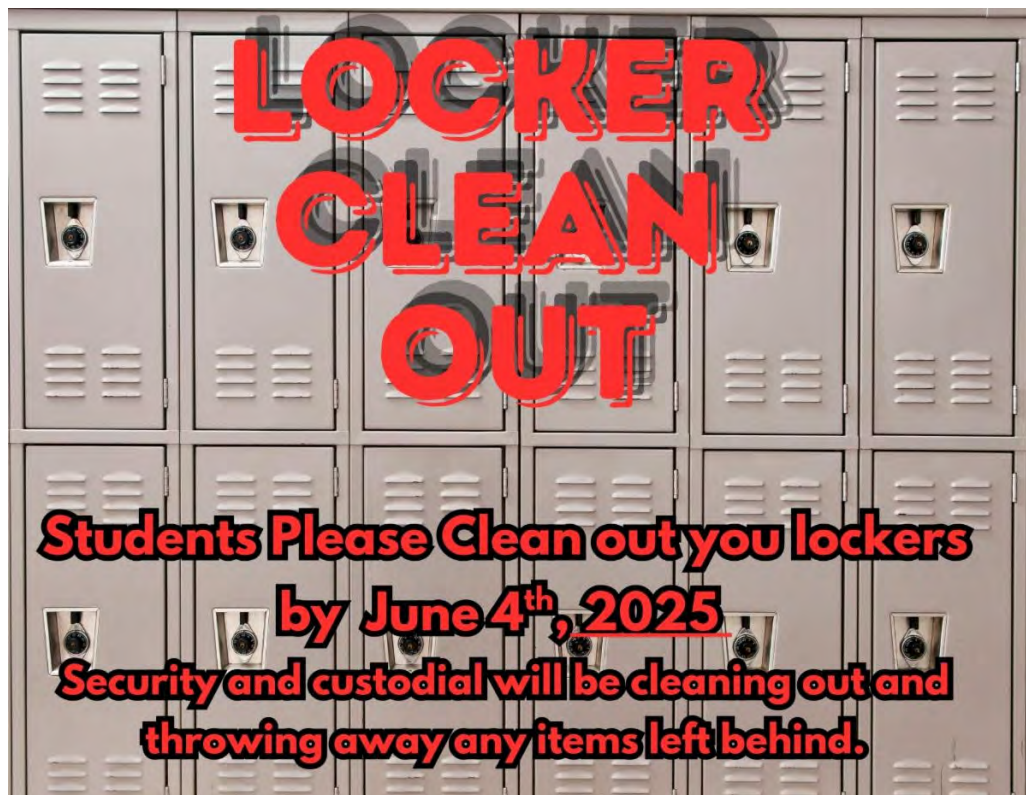

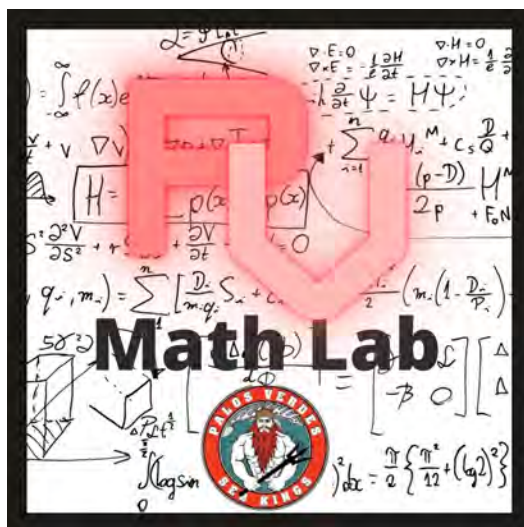

Math Lab is Free Peer Math Tutoring during lunch in room 407.

Who can attend? Any student can attend Math Lab! Math Lab provides drop-in tutoring, and students can bring homework, study guides, or any other materials they want to work with a tutor one-on-one. Once a student comes in the door, one of the staff gets them partnered with an appropriate tutor.

Who are the tutors? Math Lab Tutors apply and are selected from high level math classes, including AP Calculus BC, AP Calculus AB, AP Statistics, and PreCalculus Honors. Once selected, each tutor must attend at least 70% of Math Labs sessions at lunch. If they do, they are able to add "Peer Tutor" to their transcript.

Other benefits are there from Math Lab? All non-honors/AP math teachers, are offering one 1 extra credit point for every Math Lab attended. These classes are listed below:

CONGRESSIONAL APP CHALLENGE 2025

RULES AND GUIDELINES

HERE'S HOW TO PARTICIPATE:

1. REGISTER

Starting in early to mid May*, you can register at CongressionalAppChallenge.us. The Challenge will run until October 30th, 2025.

2. THINK OF AN APP YOU'D LIKE TO CREATE

Do you want to create a game? Do you want to create an app to solve a problem? There is no limit to what you can create for the Congressional App Challenge.

3. DESIGN YOUR APP

What will your app look like? What does it need to accomplish?

4. CREATE YOUR APP

You can work on your own, or as part of a team of up to four students. Find resources to help you on our website CongressionalAppChallenge.us

5. SUBMIT!

Submit your app anytime before October 30th. Winners will be announced in December.

*The start of registration for the Congressional App Challenge is subject to Congressional reauthorization in the 119th Congress.

CONGRESSIONAL APP CHALLENGE 2025

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

1. Students are only eligible to compete in districts that have signed up for the Challenge.
2. Students may only compete in a single district.
3. Students may only submit one application.
4. Students may compete in either:
 - a. The district in which they reside, or
 - b. The district in which they attend school.
5. Students may compete as individuals or in teams of up to four.
 - a. If competing as a team: at least 50% of the teammates must be eligible to compete in the district in which they are submitting their app.
6. Middle school and high school students are eligible. Students may not participate after having graduated high school.
7. The Challenge is subject to all applicable United States federal laws and regulations. Participation constitutes entrant's full and unconditional agreement to the Official Rules.

WHEN CAN STUDENTS ENTER THE CHALLENGE?

The registration and "Submission Period" starts at 12:00 PM (noon) Eastern Time ("ET"), in early to mid May*. Try to register before September 30th, 2025 (registration indicates your intent to compete). The deadline to submit the app is 12:00 PM ET, October 30th, 2025. (If competing as a team, all members of the team must submit their information on the registration form to participate.)

HOW DO STUDENTS ENTER THEIR APP?

Visit CongressionalAppChallenge.us to register and get more details on how to submit your entry. (If competing as a team, all members of the team must submit their information on the registration form to participate.)

NOTE:

Students may submit apps they created prior to the Challenge, as long as their apps meet the standards of eligibility, and were created within one year of the submission deadline (e.g. any time after October 24th, 2024).

**The start of registration for the Congressional App Challenge is subject to Congressional reauthorization in the 119th Congress.*

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

A complete submission will include the following components:

1. Registration Form (found on congressionalappchallenge.us)
 2. Application Elements
 - Name of your app
 - The coding language used to create the app
 - Purpose: Explain your app's purpose in ONE sentence
 - Inspiration: What inspired you to create this app?
 - Tell us about a technical/coding difficulty you faced in programming your app, and explain your solution.
 - What still needs to be improved about your app?
 3. Demonstration Video
 - Students must create a 1-3 minute video, showcasing what your app does and how it works.
 - The video must be uploaded onto a public site like Youtube or Vimeo, and set to public so the judges can view them.
- Video Requirements:
- Tell us your name(s) and the name of your app.
 - Clearly explain the purpose of your app.
 - Explain who your app is intended for.
 - Tell us what tools and coding languages you used to create your app.
 - Show us how your app is used. This constitutes the entrant's full and unconditional agreement to the Official Rules.
4. Exit Questionnaire

A mandatory and anonymous exit questionnaire will be e-mailed to all students after the submission period closes.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Established by the United States House of Representatives in 2014, this competition encourages students to create and submit their own app for the opportunity to receive national recognition. Students may participate as individuals or in teams of up to four. Congressional App Challenge (CAC) winners may be eligible to have their app featured on a display in the Capitol Building in Washington, DC, and will be honored by their Member of Congress.

Notes for High School ISPE:

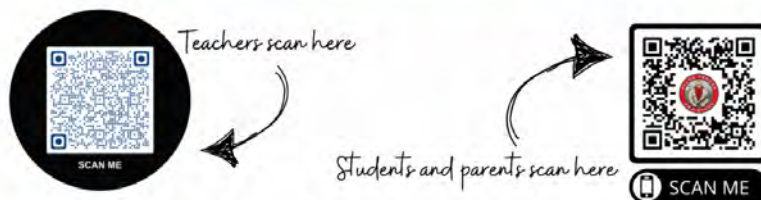

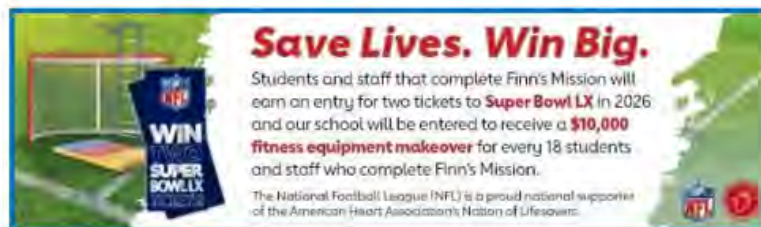

Through this program, interns volunteer at White Point Nature Education Center as well as in the adjacent Nature Preserve. Interns shadow PVPLC Nature Center Staff to assist with greeting visitors, facilitating programs, community science projects, trail monitoring, animal care and facility maintenance. E-Vehicle Safety

Please follow these safety guidelines when operating an e-vehicle (including electric bikes, scooters, and skateboards) to protect yourself and others!

WEAR A HELMET!



California law requires anyone under 18 to wear a properly fitted and fastened helmet at all times while riding an e-vehicle.



FOLLOW TRAFFIC LAWS

E-vehicle riders must follow all traffic-related laws, including stopping at traffic lights. Be aware of road hazards and pedestrians while riding.

FOLLOW THE SPEED LIMIT



The speed limit for e-bikes is 20 MPH, and the speed limit for e-scooters is 15 MPH. Be sure to abide by these speed limits at all times.

REQUIREMENTS FOR E-BIKES



In order to qualify as an e-bike, your e-vehicle must have fully operable pedals. If pedals are not present, it is considered a motorcycle, and riders must be 16 years of age or older with an M1 license. E-bikes must also have a sticker advertising of class one, two, or three; maximum speed; and watts, permanently affixed by the manufacturer.

PASSENGERS AND ATTACHMENTS



Carrying a passenger is **NOT** permitted. In addition, attaching the e-vehicle to yourself or another vehicle while on the road is forbidden.

E-SCOOTERS



In order to ride an e-scooter, you must have a driver's license or instruction permit. An e-scooter does not include motorcycles, motor-driven cycles, or motorized bicycles and mopeds.



PARKING YOUR E-VEHICLE

If you park your e-vehicle on a sidewalk, it cannot impede pedestrian traffic and should be positioned to allow for a clear path. Parking on a PVPUSD campus requires a permit. While on campus, you must walk your e-vehicle to the designated parking zone.

CARRYING ITEMS



It is **illegal** to carry any package or item that prevents you from keeping at least one hand on the handlebars while riding an e-vehicle.

MOTOR POWER LIMIT



E-vehicles must have a motor power of **less than 750 watts**. A permit is required for any e-vehicle exceeding this limit.

OPERATING UNDER THE INFLUENCE



Operating an e-vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs is **illegal** and can result in a DUI charge.

YOUR E-BIKE CAN BE IMPOUNDED!



Under the law, your e-vehicle can be **impounded** for any of the following reasons:

- Riding without a license
- DUI
- Traffic obstruction or safety hazard
- Abandonment

What Classifies as an E-Bike?



CALIFORNIA E-BIKE CLASSIFICATION CHART

California classifies e-bikes into three categories based on speed and throttle. Please review the chart below to ensure your child is adhering to the correct requirements based on their e-bike classification.

Class	Max Speed	Throttle Allowed?	Pedal Assist?	Age Requirement	Helmet Required?
Class 1	20 mph	No	Yes	No minimum age	Under 18
Class 2	20 mph	Yes	Yes	No minimum age	Under 18
Class 3	28 mph	No	Yes	16+ years old	Required for ALL riders

WHAT IS NOT AN E-BIKE?

Street illegal electric motorcycles—including Surrons, Talarías, E-Ryde Pros and many other brands—are NOT e-bikes.



Too Powerful: E-bikes are legally limited to 750 watts. Electric motorcycles can have 6,000+ watts, making them as powerful as gas motorcycles.



Speed: E-bikes have speed limits of 20-28 mph, while electric motorcycles can hit 50+ mph, making them illegal for bike paths, bike lanes, and most public roads.



No Pedals: E-bikes must have functional pedals. Electric motorcycles run entirely on a throttle, like a dirt bike. However, electric motorcycles that exceed speed and power limits are not classified as e-bikes, even if they have pedals.



License & Registration Required: Because they exceed e-bike regulations, electric motorcycles require motorcycle registration, a license, and insurance to be legal on the street.



Supervise: It's possible that your child has heard of ways to modify the settings of their e-bike to exceed the intended maximum speed. We suggest occasionally testing the bike to ensure it has not been tampered with.

WHY DOES IT MATTER?

- ☒ Riding an electric motorcycle on the street without registration is **illegal** and can result in tickets, fines, and bike impoundment.
- ☒ Electric motorcycles are **NOT allowed in bike lanes or on trails**.
- ☒ Electric motorcycles require **motorcycle-level safety gear, including a DOT-approved helmet**. Crashes at these speeds can be severe.

If you thought your child was riding an e-bike, but they're actually on an electric motorcycle, it's time to review the laws and safety concerns. These are **NOT** the same as e-bikes, and they come with bigger risks and legal responsibilities.
