

SEPTEMBER 4TH, 6PM - 7:30PM (MPR): CALTECH ADMISSION CASE STUDY

FOR STUDENTS & FAMILIES ALL ARE WELCOME!

How do strong STEM-focused institutions read and evaluate applications? A mock admissions case study provides a unique and important opportunity for students and their families to act as members of an admissions committee to review and evaluate sample applications to a fictional college... in this case, a highly selective, stem focused institution like Caltech.

Guided by Melissa Rodriguez, the Senior Assistant Director of Undergraduate Admissions for Caltech, participants will discuss the strengths and weaknesses of each candidate, ultimately making the decision to admit, waitlist or deny admission.

This activity should help demystify the college admissions process and reveal how it is not based solely on grades and/or test scores... but on a holistic review of each applicant with a particular focus on students applying to institutions in a STEM major.

This presentation is hugely important for PVIT / engineering students and all students involved with Scientific Research, Math and the Sciences.

Dear County and District Superintendents, Charter School Administrators, High School Principals, Counselors, and Scholarship Coordinators:

2026 United States Senate Youth Program

I am pleased to announce the 2026 United States Senate Youth Program (USSYP).

All public and private high schools in the state are invited to nominate up to two outstanding juniors or seniors who are interested in pursuing careers in public service to participate in this educational program coordinated by the California Department of Education (CDE).

Two student delegates from each state will be selected to attend this unique educational experience. The 64th Annual Washington Week is scheduled to be held in Washington, D.C., on March 7–14, 2026. Student delegates will participate in a comprehensive, interactive leadership program, and each will receive a \$10,000 college scholarship.

To apply, students must be nominated by their high school principal and currently be serving in an elected or appointed leadership capacity in a student government, civic, or educational organization for the entire 2025–26 school year. In addition, nominated students must be U.S. citizens or permanent legal residents, be currently enrolled in a California public or independent high school, and live in California for the entire academic year. Four finalists, consisting of two delegates and a first and second alternate, will be selected by the CDE to be California's USSYP representatives.

Information on how to apply is available on the CDE USSYP web page at https://www.cde.ca.gov/eo/in/us/. Students must first submit an Intent to Apply form by Monday, September 22 at noon. Once eligibility is confirmed for the student, the final application is then due by Monday, October 20, 2025.
